Miranda made her final residence in Moorhead, Minnesota.

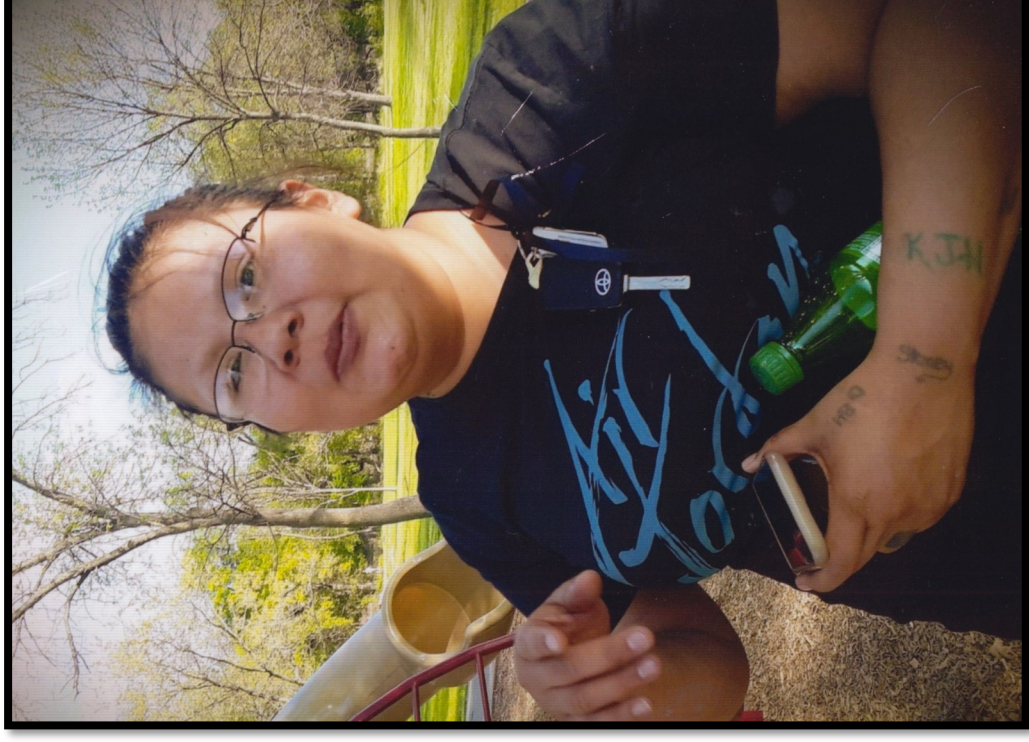
