Obituary

She may have been petite in stature, but she was old school and the phrase," I brought you into this world and I will take you out was common in her household."

When she had down time, Naomi filled her home with music. She enjoyed gospel soul and R & B. The Temptations, Smokey Robinson, Marvin Gaye, Stevie Wonder, Gladys Night to name a few. She liked songs that told a story and made you sing along with the record. Naomi was a brilliant reflection of faith and beauty as well. She was well composed, beautifully adorned and reasonably quiet until the Ohio State Buckeyes came on. She was a huge fan and had no problem cheering her team on. Until 2022, Dgtr.
