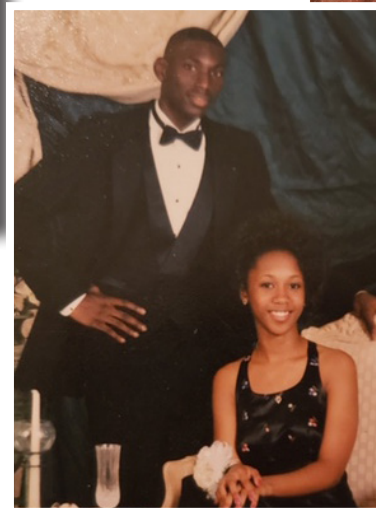






His Bouquet
