Jill "Queen" Rene Scott, daughter of Aldon Wesley "Scottie" and Retha Lucy (Anderson) Scott, was born November 10, 1959, in McPherson, KS. She was one of seven children born to the Scott family and of all the siblings, Jill was the one with the most "unique" personality. She was known for saying and doing just about anything.

She had lived most of her life in McPherson County and graduated from Lindsborg High School in 1977. Prior to retirement, Jill worked for many years as an operator at Johns Manville in McPherson.

Jill was affectionately known as the "Queen" of the family. She was self-appointed with the royal title. In turn, she expected to be treated by others as Royalty. She was the Queen of sending inappropriate greeting cards to family members especially to Uncle Jim. She took great pride in making him laugh and shocking him with her pranks.

Punctuality was her trademark, and Jill was always known to be early for everything she did and everywhere she went. It was a trait handed down from her mother who always said, "It's better to be five minutes early than one minute late." Jill lived by that rule to the extreme! For years, she went an hour early to her job. When asked why she said, "In case I have a flat tire I can get it fixed and still be on time!" Once she was providing snacks for Kelcie's volleyball team and was supposed to take a veggie tray to share with the girls. Of course, she prepared it the night before the tournament and put it in the trunk of her car overnight so it would be ready. It happened to be cold that night and the veggie tray was frozen solid by morning so they couldn't use it! At least she had done it early!

Jill enjoyed watching sporting events on television and was an avid fan of the Kansas City Chiefs and University of Kansas Basketball.

Jill passed away peacefully on Sunday, May 8, 2022, at McPherson Hospital. She was sixty-two.
