
An Angel

She attended Lake Benton Public School in Lake Benton, Minnesota and graduated in 1968. Doreen worked at Alexander's Cafe & as the bookkeeper for Lake Benton Co-op for many years. On October 28, 1983, Doreen was united in marriage to Leon Krog in Brookings, South Dakota. After their marriage, the couple moved to Brookings where Doreen worked in the K-Mart men's department until they moved to their lake home on the shores of Lake Benton in the summer of 1985. Doreen was a stay-at-home mom until 1988 when she became part owner with her sister, Lisa, and opened Perfect Styles Beauty Shop in Marshall, Minnesota.
