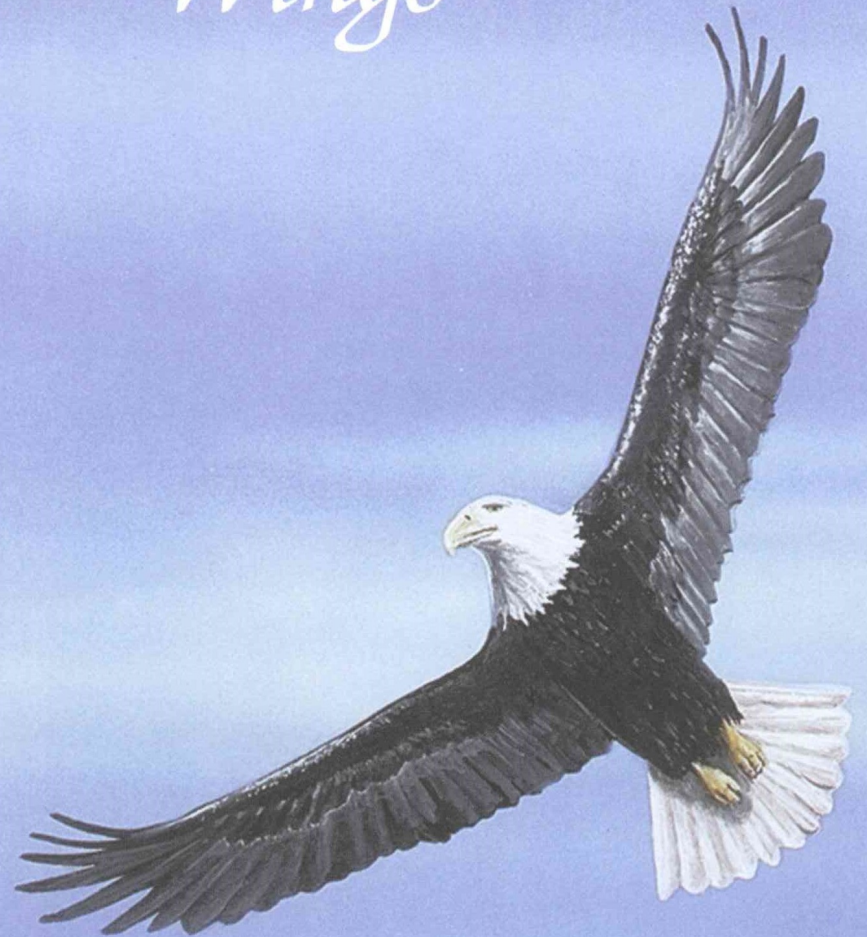
“But those who wait on the Lord shall renew their strength. They shall mount up with wings like eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint.”

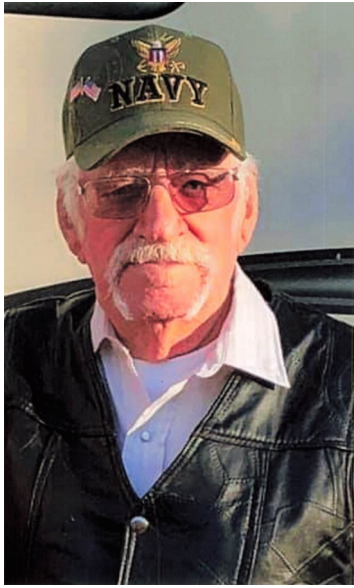

Arnold Waggy, 88, Mandan, passed away January 12, 2022 at a Bismarck hospital.

Arnold Clyde Waggy was born May 23, 1933 in Mandan, ND to Watter and Ida (Nidigger) Waggy. He attended school in Shields, ND and worked on his family farm until he was 20 years old.

In August of 1953, Arnold enlisted in the Navy. While serving, Arnold traveled the world and was a crewmember on the USS Intrepid. In November of that year, he married his wife, Hazel (Boulter) Waggy, while on leave and they were married for 25 years until her passing. On July 5, 1957, Arnold was honorably discharged from his military service.
