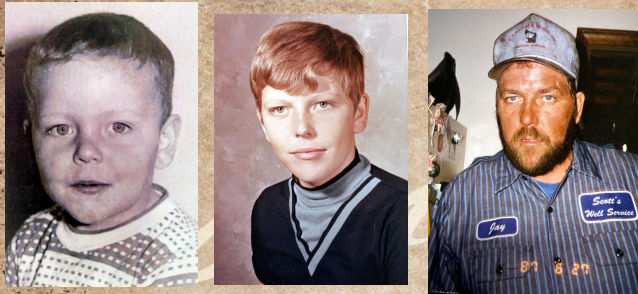


**In Loving Memory
