HER Story

Amelia Wallace was born on March 2, 1927, in Clarks Hills, South Carolina, to the late Henry and Lelar Briscoe, with whom she was the youngest among 12 siblings, all of whom preceded her in death, except for her surviving sister-in-law, Portia Briscoe. During her youth, the family relocated to Philadelphia, where Amelia later married and raised six children. Sadly, three of her children, Ronald Briscoe, Joseph Wallace, and Frederick Wallace, Sr. passed away before her.

According to Psalm 90:10a, which states, "Our days may come to seventy years, or eighty, if our strength endures." Amelia was blessed to live 97 years until she peacefully passed away on July 8, 2024.

Amelia pursued her education at Manna & Berean Bible Institutes, earning various certificates in Biblical studies. She dedicated herself to serving her church community, faithfully teaching Sunday School, serving as church clerk, and leading successful fundraisers. For many years, she also contributed her talents to the church choir, combining her passion for cooking with her commitment to church activities.

Amelia's life radiated her love for the Lord, and she was instrumental in guiding many individuals to Christ. She honored the leadership of her pastors over the years, including the late Reverends T. Bullock, H. Jackson, Dr. R. Sherfield, and presently, James Harrington, Sr. of Loving Memorial Pentecostal Church. Her impact extended beyond her church, earning recognition from city officials, including a citation from former Senator Shirley Kitchen during her 80th Birthday Gala.

A testament to her community involvement, Amelia is prominently featured in a mural near the 10th and Diamond Street underpass in Philadelphia, a project initiated by the Mural Arts Railway Enhancement Project in September 2020 as reported by Temple News.

After over 30 years of dedicated service, Amelia retired as a Professional Chef and head cook with the School District of Philadelphia. Her culinary skills were cherished by her family and church community, particularly her homemade cakes and pies.

Amelia leaves behind a legacy cherished by her children Shirley Briscoe, Elder Princeda Rosser, Anthony Wallace (and his wife Leonia), and her beloved grandson Frederick Jr. (and his wife Sharneese), who was like a son to her. She is also remembered fondly by her special daughters-in-law Renee, Lillie, and Michelle, as well as her god-daughter Arletha Hale. Amelia's expansive family includes 25+ grandchildren, 33+ great-grandchildren, 15 great-great-grandchildren, and numerous nephews, nieces, cousins, and friends who deeply loved and respected her.

Amelia Wallace will be dearly missed, but her life of faith, service, and love will continue to inspire all who were fortunate enough to know her.
