She loved playing with her sister and family, frequently attending city band practice in Worthington.

After graduating high school, Darlene attended college at Luther College at Decorah, Iowa. She played the trumpet all four years in college and graduated in 1958 with a degree in music and elementary education. Darlene taught elementary music for one year in Fairmont, Minnesota before marrying her high school sweetheart, Marvin Larson, on June 12, 1959, at First Lutheran Church in Worthington, Minnesota. The couple then moved to Rock Island, Illinois, where Darlene taught at the elementary school to support Marvin as he attended seminary school.

Marvin was ordained in 1963 and together they served parishes in Herman, Detroit Lakes, Alexandria, and Afton. Darlene was very involved in all the parishes – directing choirs, attending circles, quilting, etc., she also volunteered at the reception desk for Douglas County Hospital for many years as well as serving on various committees for several organizations in Alexandria throughout the years.

No matter how busy life became with her parish and volunteer work, Darlene's first priority always remained her three children. She was a wonderful mom who always put her children first, attending many concerts, games, and after school activities.
