THE LIFE STORY OF YVONNE B. MCINTOSH

Yvonne Bernadette McIntosh was born in Philadelphia, PA on October 20th, 1940. She was the beloved daughter of the late Benjamin and Lillian Tayale. On July 4, 2024, Yvonne was called home.

Yvonne was educated in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, where she attended J. W. Hallahan Catholic High School for Girls. After high school, she briefly worked in the floral department at a funeral home. Yvonne dedicated her life to her family, serving as a devoted housewife shortly after graduation. She was married to the late Richard McIntosh Jr in September of 1961 and they welcomed two children, Meshia and Lavette. Shortly after marriage, they purchased a home in the Germantown section of Philadelphia where Yvonne resided until her death. Richard and Yvonne were married for 28 years until his passing in 1989.

Yvonne was known for her religious beliefs. She was a member of Immaculate Conception Church. Her impeccable crafts around the house, her love for baking "sweet bread", her love for cooking "chicken and dumplings", and her love for the Lord was everything to her. You could find her regularly carrying around a pair of rosary beads. Yvonne was very proud of her Panamanian and Native American heritage. She was known for having endless amounts of Native American art throughout her home.

Yvonne loved her friends and shared a special bond with each of them. She played a major role in their lives by giving them encouraging words of wisdom. Everyone knew to come to Yvonne because she could hold a captivating conversation.
