Remembering the life of...

Pauline C. Merrick - Mahpiya Tokah Win “She’s a leader in heaven”, the Matriarch of the Matocatka Tiwahe 90, of St. Michael ND began her wanagi ta’canku to the Star nation on Thursday, February 22, 2024, with her loving family at her side.

Pauline began her earthly journey on December 14, 1933, to Sarah Hopkins and Simon Leftbear at the hospital in Fort Totten ND, the youngest of their two (2) children. She was the granddaughter of Chief MatoCatka of the Wahpeton band. She was raised by her aunt Martha Glazer in Tokio, ND and was educated at boarding schools in St. Michael’s Indian Mission and Stephan, SD. During school she enjoyed playing basketball with her classmate Lilly Owlboy. Her memorable childhood memories were dancing at the local pow wows.

On July 14, 1953, she was united in marriage to Frank Merrick and to this union was born four (4) children Deborah, Brenda, Fulton and Catherine. The family relocated to Los Angeles, California for several years and then to Chicago, Illinois, where they would gainfully work and raise their children. In 1969, the family returned back home to Spirit Lake due to her aunt Martha’s car accident. At this time, Pauline cared for her sister, brothers and aunt until she recovered. Her aunt Martha was the President of the Lone Buffalo Club and also organized the fundraising efforts. Pauline was an active member of the Club and appreciated helping her aunt.

Pauline and Frank established their home in St. Michael, ND. They were foster parents and welcomed their home to many children including raising Dennis Johnson. She was a stay at home mother who was devoted to her family and took pride in their homestead. Pauline enjoyed traveling to pow wows, and could always pick a winner for the drum and dance contests. She bowled and participated in many bowling leagues locally and in Chicago. Pauline pitched and played softball until she was 51 years old. She was a very fluent speaker in her Dakota language and loved listening to pow wow and prayer songs.

After nearly 61 years of marriage her husband Frank passed away in 2014. Her recent favorite memory was when the Mandan, Hidatsa, Arikara (MHA) 2022 Little Shell Celebration honored and flown her husband Frank’s United States Army flag. She was proud of her husband’s military service.

Pauline was a widow of a World War II Veteran. She lived a humble and beautiful life. She believed in the Dakota values of Fortitude, Courage, Generosity, and Wisdom. She served as a good example of a strong inspirational Dakota woman. Although Kunsi Pauline may no longer walk beside us, her spirit and strength will be with us always. She was a blessing to us all.
