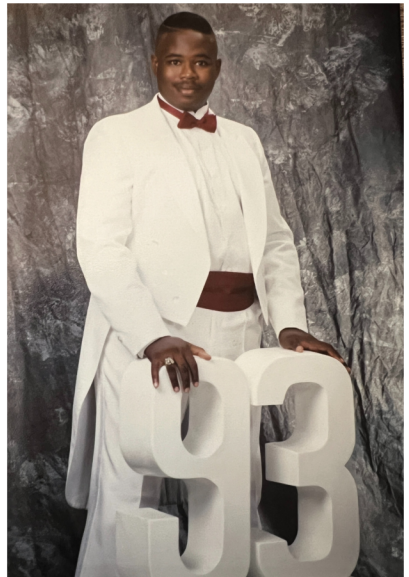
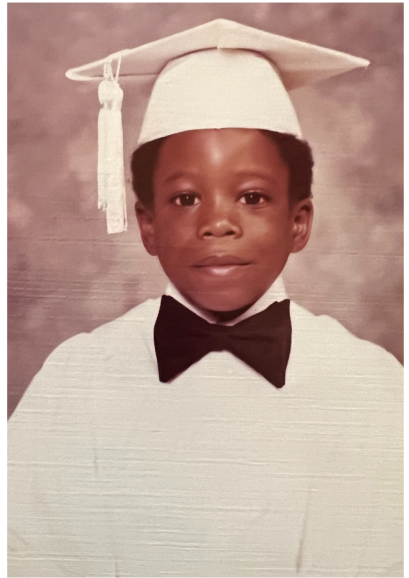

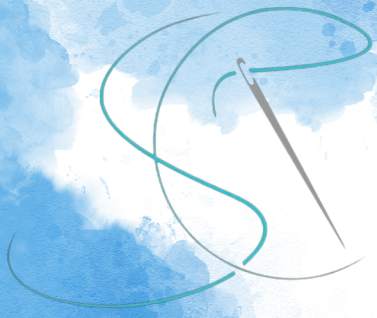

Celebrating the Life, Legacy, and Love of Dr. Dillard Allen Scott

Dr. Dillard Allen Scott was born Edward Miles, Jr. on May 1, 1975, in Las Vegas, Nevada, to Beverly Scott-Miles and Elder Edward Miles, Sr.

Dillard accepted Christ at age six and was baptized under the late Reverend A.J. Thompson, Pastor of Victory Baptist Church. He was involved in youth activities and was a youth choir member. He later co-chaired the city-wide youth workshop for 25 years. His faith, trust, and belief in God never let him compromise his spiritual convictions. His membership followed Reverend A.J. Thompson to Zion Chapel until he united with Mountaintop Faith Ministries, pastored by Bishop Clinton House, and remained a member until his demise.

Dillard attended O.K. Adcock, Frank Garside, Bonanza, and later Cimarron-Memorial High School, where he graduated in 1993. He continued his education at the Community College of Southern Nevada and later received his doctorate in Criminology.

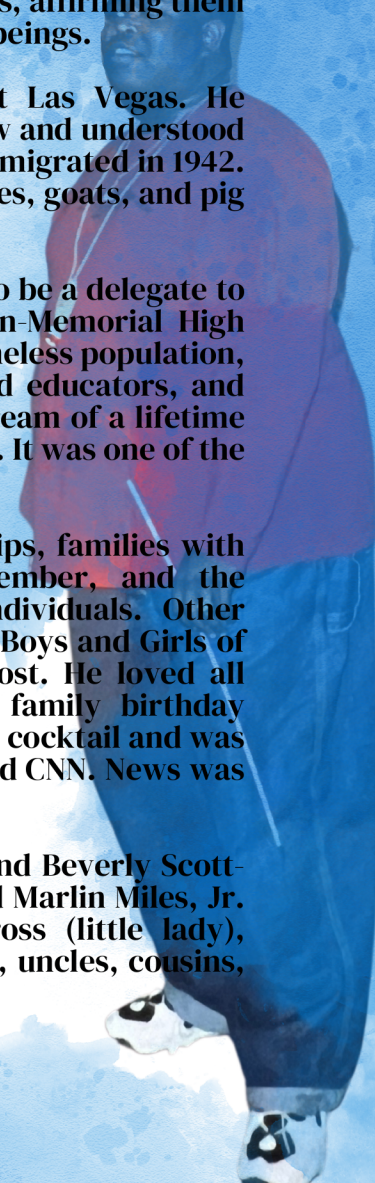
Dillard worked for numerous Fortune 500 companies before entering the Behavioral Health field. He was very compassionate and diligent in the treatment and rehabilitation of individuals experiencing mental health and substance abuse challenges. He continued serving others in this area until his health declined. He fought for mental health to the end, recognizing it was a far more significant problem to society than was realized. His love and kindness for the clients he served was second to none. He served his clients, affirming them that no matter what they were experiencing in life, they too, were human beings.

Dillard expressed deep concerns for the community, especially West Las Vegas. He advocated for infrastructure and protested against gentrification. He knew and understood the rich culture and history of West Las Vegas, to which his grandparents migrated in 1942. He loved hearing the stories from the tents, dirt roads, grapevines, fig trees, goats, and pig pens.

Dillard's political aspirations started in high school when he was elected to be a delegate to Nevada Boys State. He was elected to the Student Council at Cimarron-Memorial High School. He also served as a counselor for Camp Anytown, counted the homeless population, advocated for the homeless, displaced teens, Clark County students and educators, and better housing conditions for the disadvantaged. In 2020, he fulfilled a dream of a lifetime when he filed a declaration of candidacy for County Commission District D. It was one of the most rewarding experiences of his lifetime.

Dillard was instrumental in providing graduating seniors with scholarships, families with Thanksgiving day meals, toys to the community annually in December, and the presentation of the Great Scott Awards to deserving community individuals. Other accomplishments include the Antidote radio show, Scottish Couture, and Boys and Girls of Nevada, a nonprofit organization. Dillard loved family first and foremost. He loved all holidays, including Super Bowl parties, Christmas at midnight, and family birthday celebrations were very special to him. He also loved fine dining and a good cocktail and was an avid Dallas Cowboys fan. Dillard loved gospel, jazz, and blues music and CNN. News was a daily necessity.

He leaves to cherish his memories his parents, Elder Edward Miles, Sr. and Beverly Scott-Miles, brother Marlin M. Miles, Sr. (Hurley), Nephews Robert M. Miles and Marlin Miles, Jr. (Stink), Niece Mailynn, great niece Andrea, goddaughter Dymond Cross (little lady), godmother Cleo Wilson-Coleman, Madea Beatrice Turner, a host of aunts, uncles, cousins, friends and his line brothers of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc.
