
Victor "Vic" Anheluk

The most cherished memories during the "farm years' were entertaining and spending time with his grandchildren Kyle and Kayla and always supporting them during their sporting events, school programs, birthdays, and graduations. During this time, Medora, ND had a special place in Dad's heart, he spent 10 years as a maintenance worker there, it was his favorite job. Vic loved and enjoyed meeting all kinds of people from all over the world. His family always joked that no matter where Vic went, he always ran into someone that he knew, without fail. Vic was extremely proud of the way he gave back to his community that included being a Mandan American Legion Post Commander, member of the West Plains REC, the Upper MO GNT of Sidney, MT and later served as a member of the board of Basin Electric, Bismarck ND. In 2005, Vic and Sharon moved back to Mandan.
