Jay married his boo, Tawanna, on September 15, 2001, and they were married for 23 years.

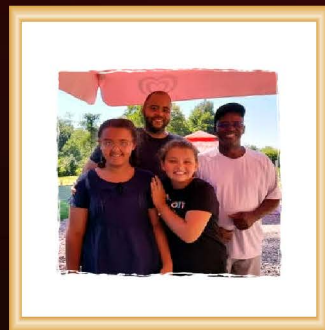
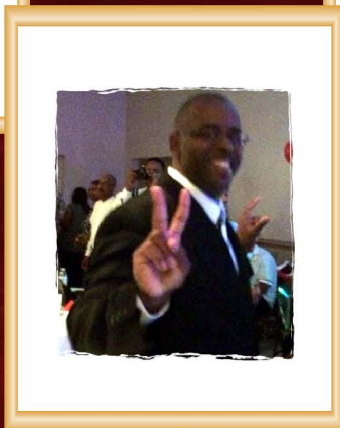
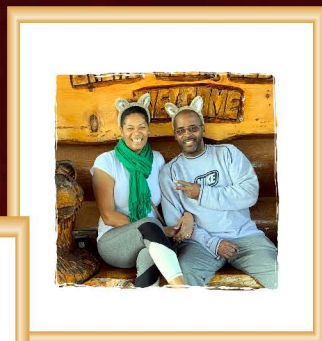
He passed away surrounded by love and comfort with his family by his side.
