Approaching our Father2. Advancing His kingdom3. Presenting our personal needs4. Repenting of sin / requesting forgiveness5. Requesting deliverance6. Acknowledging God's kingdom and reignINITIAL INSIGHTSPrayer is an individualized, personal dialogue with the Monarch of the Universe.The Roman gods were markedly different from the God of heaven. Even the way the Jews addressed God was dramatically different from the way Jesus prayed.To this day, there is no religion in the world that worships a god that is anything like the God of Scripture.

Our Father

Matthew 6:9 NKJV

In this manner, therefore, pray: Our Father in heaven, Hallowed be Your name.

1. Approaching Our Father

"Our Father". . . implies a personal, caring God who showers mercy on all humankind. Simply uttering these two words reminds us that we are part of the brotherhood of humankind--the vast, interconnected web of humanity." . . . in Heaven"We acknowledge where He is, and the scope of His authority. Similar to Daniel's statement: "There is a God in heaven."My Father is bigger than the challenges that confront me.He is God all mighty-in heaven-yet He is MY Father--Father to this little, insignificant earthling. I matter to Him. The people in my world matter to Him."HALLOWED BE YOUR NAME"Thayer Greek Lexicon on 'hallowed': "to render or acknowledge to be venerable"When we call the name of the Lord holy, set apart, venerable; when we take that holy name on our lips--are we carrying it with sacred care?In praying this prayer, we are asking God to make our lives, lives in which His name is honored and enshrined. Hezekiah Addresses God

2 Kings 19:14-15 NKJV

2. Advancing His Kingdom

We acknowledge that His kingdom is not here now so we pray that it may advance. We must always keep our interests centered on the advancing of the Kingdom of Heaven. Establish Your kingdom in my life . . . in my world . . . through me. Use me. In Daniel 9, he demonstrates this kind of prayer, asking God to advance His kingdom on earth while acknowledging his sin and the sin of his people.

Daniel 9:16-19 NKJV

"O Lord, according to all Your righteousness, I pray, let Your anger and Your fury be turned away from Your city Jerusalem, Your holy mountain; because for our sins, and for the iniquities of our fathers, Jerusalem and Your people are a reproach to all those around us. Now therefore, our God, hear the prayer of Your servant, and his supplications, and for the Lord's sake cause Your face to shine on Your sanctuary, which is desolate. O my God, incline Your ear and hear; open Your eyes and see our desolations, and the city which is called by Your name; for we do not present our supplications before You because of our righteous deeds, but because of Your great mercies. 3. Presenting Our Personal Needs

We acknowledge God as the source of ALL we have. We acknowledge our dependence. We acknowledge that our personal needs matter to Him.Notice, too, this is a plural request. We do not ask for ourselves alone. We bring to our Heavenly Father, not only our own needs, but the needs of those around us. We intercede on other's behalf.

Seek First the Kingdom

Matthew 6:30-33 NKJV

Now if God so clothes the grass of the field, which today is, and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will He not much more clothe you, O you of little faith? "Therefore do not worry, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' For after all these things the Gentiles seek. For your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you. Go to Bible Reader »

Asking to Give

Luke 11:5-9 NKJV

And He said to them, "Which of you shall have a friend, and go to him at midnight and say to him, 'Friend, lend me three loaves; for a friend of mine has come to me on his journey, and I have nothing to set before him'; and he will answer from within and say, 'Do not trouble me; the door is now shut, and my children are with me in bed; I cannot rise and give to you'? Ezra Repents

Ezra 9:6-10 NKJV

Since the days of our fathers to this day we have been very guilty, and for our iniquities we, our kings, and our priests have been delivered into the hand of the kings of the lands, to the sword, to captivity, to plunder, and to humiliation, as it is this day. And now for a little while grace has been shown from the Lord our God, to leave us a remnant to escape, and to give us a peg in His holy place, that our God may enlighten our eyes and give us a measure of revival in our bondage. Daniel Reprents

Yes, all Israel has transgressed Your law, and has departed so as not to obey Your voice; therefore the curse and the oath written in the Law of Moses the servant of God have been poured out on us, because we have sinned against Him.

4. Repenting / Asking Forgiveness, pt 1

Repentance is specific. It acknowledges God's rightness and my wickedness. It asks for mercy and cries out for transformation, not merely pardon. It requests righteousness in exchange for our sin. Personal repentance can also be prayed on behalf of the corporate body of the church, as Daniel and Ezra did.

Jesus Expounds on Forgiveness

Matthew 6:14-15 NKJV

"For if you forgive men their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. But if you do not forgive men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses.

A Parable of Forgiveness

Matthew 18:21-35 NKJV

Then Peter came to Him and said, "Lord, how often shall my brother sin against me, and I forgive him? Up to seven times?" Jesus said to him, "I do not say to you, up to seven times, but up to seventy times seven. Therefore the kingdom of heaven is like a certain king who wanted to settle accounts with his servants. And when he had begun to settle accounts, one was brought to him who owed him ten thousand talents. But as he was not able to pay, his master commanded that he be sold, with his wife and children and all that he had, and that payment be made. The servant therefore fell down before him, saying, 'Master, have patience with me, and I will pay you all.' Then the master of that servant was moved with compassion, released him, and forgave him the debt. "But that servant went out and found one of his fellow servants who owed him a hundred denarii; and he laid hands on him and took him by the throat, saying, 'Pay me what you owe!' So his fellow servant fell down at his feet and begged him, saying, 'Have patience with me, and I will pay you all.' And he would not, but went and threw him into prison till he should pay the debt. So when his fellow servants saw what had been done, they were very grieved, and came and told their master all that had been done. Then his master, after he had called him, said to him, 'You wicked servant! I forgave you all that debt because you begged me. Should you not also have had compassion on your fellow servant, just as I had pity on you?' And his master was angry, and delivered him to the torturers until he should pay all that was due to him. "So My

heavenly Father also will do to you if each of you, from his heart, does not forgive his brother his trespasses." Go to Bible Reader »

4. Repenting / Asking for Forgiveness, pt 2

Only as we forgive others are we able to experience the forgiveness of God toward us. What serious words these are. How often would I really wish to be forgiven as I forgive. Jesus desires us, in asking for our own forgiveness, to consider how we are extending mercy to those who have wronged us. When I request forgiveness in this way, I always come away seeking to be exceedingly liberal in my forgiveness because that's the kind of forgiveness I wish to receive.

Do Not Lead Us Into Temptation

Matthew 6:13 NKJV

And do not lead us into temptation, But deliver us from the evil one. For Yours is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. Amen.

Jesus Sets the Example

John 17:9-17 NKJV

"I pray for them. I do not pray for the world but for those whom You have given Me, for they are Yours. And all Mine are Yours, and Yours are Mine, and I am glorified in them. Now I am no longer in the world, but these are in the world, and I come to You. Holy Father, keep through Your name those whom You have given Me, that they may be one as We are. While I was with them in the world, I kept them in Your name. Those whom You gave Me I have kept; and none of them is lost except the son of perdition, that the Scripture might be fulfilled. But now I come to You, and these things I speak in the world, that they may have My joy fulfilled in themselves. I have given them Your word; and the world has hated them because they are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. I do not pray that You should take them out of the world, but that You should keep them from the evil one. They are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. Sanctify them by Your truth. Your word is truth.

5. Requesting Deliverance

Am I willing this day to follow the path that I am requesting to be lead in? This is a request that God would keep us by His truth, from the evil one. It is not simply a request for protection, but an agreement to walk in the light of truth shining across our path. We can know truth—but we cannot keep ourselves in it . . . so it is we pray that HE WILL KEEP OUR FEET IN THE PATH AND WE AGREE TO COOPERATE WITH HIS WORK.

Matthew 6:13 NKJV

6. Acknowledging God's Kingdom and Reign

In once again acknowledging God's kingdom and reign, we turn our minds off of our own needs, back to the One who has all power at His disposal. We acknowledge His power and authority in our lives and world. We acknowledge our dependence on His power for the fulfilling of our own requests. We place ourselves, again, in line with His work and mission.

2 Kings 19:19 NKJV
