

Officer Noah Shahnavaz was born on May 18, 1998, in Indianapolis, Indiana. Noah was senselessly killed in the line of duty on July 31, 2022, during a routine traffic stop. Noah served as an officer with the Elwood Police Department for only 11 months.

Noah graduated from Fishers High School in 2016, and shortly thereafter, proudly joined the United States Army, serving in the 591 st Military Policy Company. He achieved the rank of Sergeant and earned his Air Assault Badge during his 5-year term in the Army which ended in the spring of 2021.

Following his discharge from the Army, Noah was honored to have joined the Elwood Police Department and served the community and his fellow officers with pride.

Noah's path in life was never easy. He always worked relentlessly to overcome any challenges or barriers. Actually, a more accurate reflection would be to say that Noah destroyed any barriers that got in his way. He was singularly focused on his life-long goal of becoming a police officer and finally achieved his dream in the summer of 2021. To say he was a good officer is an understatement. Noah's work ethic was unmatched.

He knew what it was like to struggle and to succeed, and wove all these experiences into the beautiful man, son, brother, grandson, cousin, friend, officer, and community member that he was.

Noah is beloved by so many. He leaves behind countless friends from his childhood, high school, and his Army days, as well as those he made in Elwood, who we now consider his brothers and sisters. Our hearts have been
