Joseph (Joe Boy) Nathaniel Branch



"Let not your heart be troubled: ye believe in God, believe also in me. In my father's house are many mansions: if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again, and receive you unto myself; that where I am, there ye may be also. And whither I go ye know, and the way ye know." John 14: 1-4

Mr. Joseph Nathaniel Branch, affectionately known as 'Joe Boy', put on his wings and took flight to his heavenly home on April 28, 2023, surrounded by his family and friends. "For this God is our God, forever and ever: he will be our guide even unto death." – Psalm 48: 14.

Joseph Nathaniel Battise Branch was born on July 7, 1939 to Ms. Mattie Branch and Mr. Nathaniel Battise, both who preceded him in death.

Joseph was educated in the Savannah-Chatham County school system and graduated from Alfred E. Beach in 1957. Joseph heard the call of the Holy Spirit at an early age and responded "Here I am Lord," and was baptized at Minna's Landing in White Bluff. He served diligently in the Choir. He was united in Holy Matrimony to "the love of his life" Sallie Middleton and God blessed their union with two daughters.

Joseph Branch was a well-respected, and a true leader of men. After graduating from Beach High School, he worked as a cement finisher until he was drafted into the United States Army on May 8, 1962, and he began his Army career as a telephone lineman.

In 1964, Joseph reenlisted and was stationed to Fort Jackson, SC for Drill Sergeant School. Assigned to South Vietnam in 1965, he was awarded several commendations including the Combat Infantryman's Badge, the Meritorious Service Medal of Valor, the Vietnam Service Medal, and the Vietnam Campaign Medal.

In 1965, Joseph served a 4-year tour in Aschaffenburg, Germany and was promoted to Staff Sergeant. He was then assigned in 1969 to Advanced Drill Sergeant Academy in Fort Ord, California, upon completion he was promoted to Sergeant First Class. In January 1971, he was assigned to the Boston Recruiting Command as Station Commander in Plymouth, Massachusetts. While in Massachusetts, he earned a bachelor's degree in business administration from Northeastern University.

In July 1977, Joseph was assigned to Jacksonville, Florida where he served as Station Commander in Vidalia, Georgia and was promoted to the rank of First Sergeant (E-8). He was also reunited with Second Mount Peasant Baptist Church.

After returning to his second tour of duty in Korea for one year, he was then assigned to Hunter Army Airfield as First Sergeant over A Company 24th Battalion Combat Aviation. In 1982, Joseph was selected to attend the Sergeant Major Academy in Fort Bliss, Texas; instead, he chose to retire on January 1, 1983.

Soon after he was offered a position with the United States Postal Service; where after three years, he was trained and promoted to Level 15 Supervisor. Joseph retired from the United States Postal Service in 1999.

In 1990, Joseph was ordained as a Deacon under Reverend Anthony Harris. Joseph was faithful and loyal to the calling and followed the commandments of God. He always did as the Lord commanded, always praying for his family, as well as the whole world. Joseph was loyal to his members and the surrounding community through visitations, prayers, shopping- no matter what the circumstance called for he was always there until his health started to fail.

Joseph made his transition to Jerusalem on Friday, April 28, 2023.

He was preceded in death by Charles and Princess Battise (Great Grandfather and Mother), Francean L. Haynes (Grandmother), Nathaniel Battise (Father), Phillip Mack (2nd Father), Mattie Branch Mack (Mother), 3 Brothers-in-law (Daniel Dambeck, Moses Middleton, and Arthur Hall), 3 Sisters-in-law (Viola Middleton, Anna Harris, and Elise Gibbons), 3 nephews (Craig Harris, Johnny Ferguson, and Snelson Harris, Jr.), and several aunts and an uncle.

He leaves behind to cherish a lifetime of memories, a beloved and devoted wife, Mrs. Sallie M. Branch; 3 daughters, Mrs. Yolanda (Samuel) Roundtree, Ms. Anita M. Branch-Bell, and Mrs. Ivona Renee' (Anthony) Anderson; 2 grandchildren, Mrs. Nicole (Matthew) Kral and Anthony J. Anderson; 2 Goddaughters, Mrs. Lillian (Reverend Solomon) Washington and Ms. Scheherezade Roundtree; 2 sisters, Mrs. Emma Hall and Ms. Dorothy Mitchell; a sister-in-law, Mrs. Delores Dambeck; 2 nephews, Mr. Lewis (Joan) Hall and Mr. Melvin Mitchell; and a niece, Ms. Pamela Mitchell; a special friend, Mr. Otis (Delores) Johnson; and a host of cousins, friends and co-workers.
