The Obituary

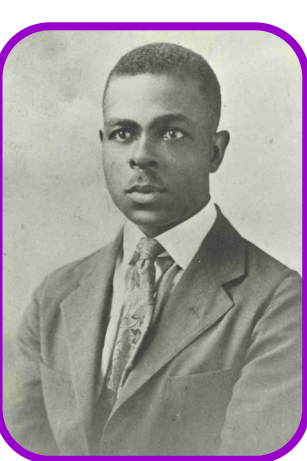
