For Today: About Our Gospel Hymn Writers

Robert Lowry



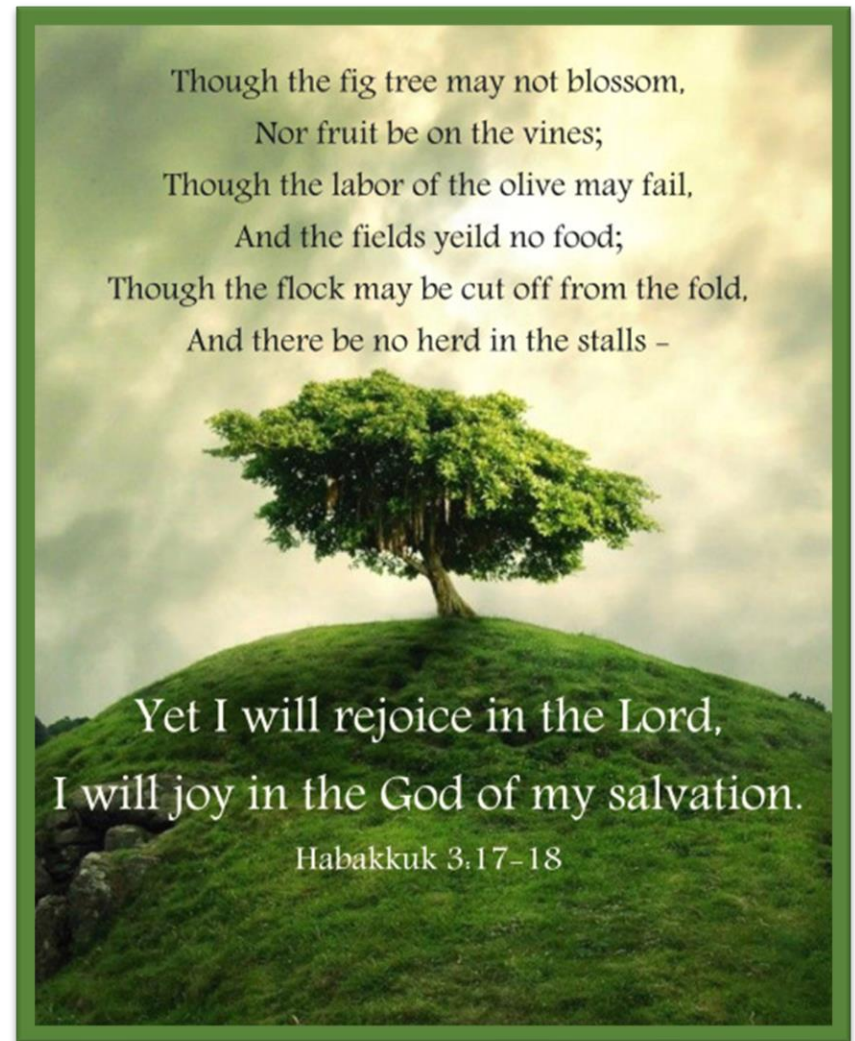
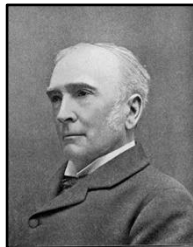
Born in Philadelphia in 1826, Robert Lowry graduated from Lewisburg University and received ordination as a Baptist Minister. He is remembered as a most excellent preacher, a thorough Bible student, and a brilliant and interesting speaker with a memorable sense of humor. He could thrill an audience with his vivid descriptions, inspiring others with the same thoughts that inspired him. His melodies are sung around the globe.

A reporter once asked him about his method of composition. His reply was, "I have no method... When anything good strikes me, no matter where I am, I jot it down, often the margin of a newspaper or the back of an envelope. The tunes of nearly all the hymns I have written have been completed on paper before I tried them on the organ. Frequently the words of the hymn and the music have been written at the same time."

His most popular gospel melodies include: "Shall We Gather at the River?," "One More Day's Work for Jesus," "I Need Thee Every Hour," "All the Way My Savior Leads Me," and "We're Marching to Zion." Dr. Lowry died in 1899, yet his sermons in gospel song are still heard and are doing good.

William Henry Draper

"All Creatures of our God and King" is an English Christian Easter hymn by William Henry Draper, based on a poem by St. Francis of Assisi in 1225, based on Psalm 148. It was first published in a hymn book in 1919. Draper was rector of a Church of England parish church and he wrote the song for his church's children's Whitsun (the English designation for Pentecost) festival. The hymn currently is used in 179 different hymn books.

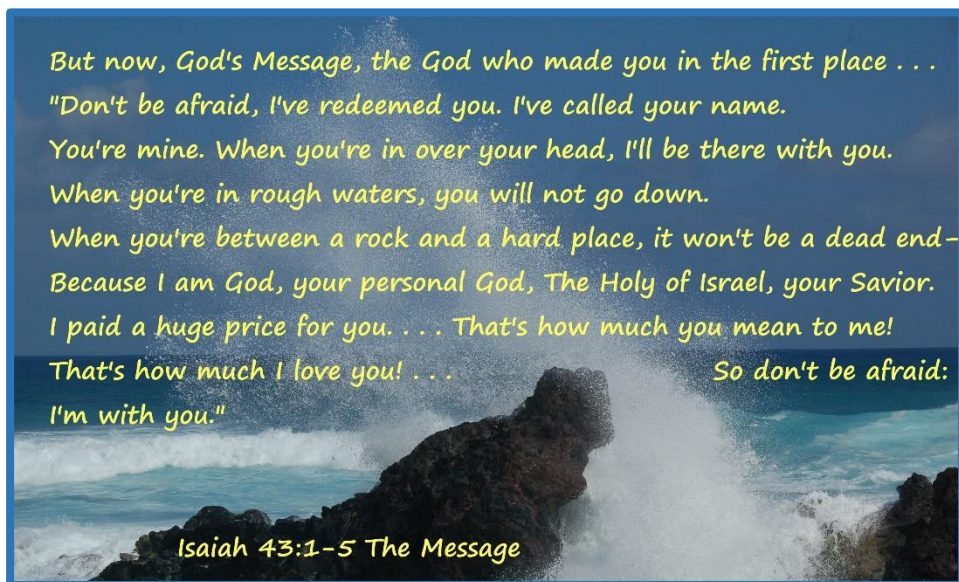
