Rebecca "Becky" S. Clow, 74 of Devils Lake ND passed away on Tuesday, January 30, 2024.

Rebecca Susan Clow, oldest child of Lyle and Donna (Johnson) Clow was born on November 19, 1949, at Hallock MN. Becky grew up on the family farm at Humboldt MN. She attended school there and graduated from Humboldt St. Vincent High School with the class of 1967. She continued her education at the University of Minnesota-Crookston, UND at Grand Forks, ND and earned a degree in accounting from Moorhead State University. She worked in Fargo, ND as a bookkeeper for a time until starting a 30 plus year career with the USDA-Soil Conservation District. She then attended NDSU, Fargo and earned her degree in Agriculture.

Becky began her work with the Soil Conservation District in Park River, ND, Mandan, ND and at Fessenden in Wells County. In 1996 she transferred to Devils Lake and worked here until retiring in 2011. She was a dedicated, hard-working employee, but found that working behind a desk in administration was not for her, she always enjoyed working out in the field more than anything.

Becky was a farm girl through and through. She loved the outdoors, wildflowers, planting trees and a soft spot for animals, all kinds of animals but she always was the proud owner of dogs and cats throughout her life.

As the oldest, Becky cared for her parents when she could, and they cared for her. She embodied Christmas. She was Santa Claus to everyone. She loved to cook and bake. When living in Park River, she lived close to the school and friends of her siblings would frequently stop for something to eat. Becky always had a delicious treat. She knew the family favorites too and you could count on Becky to bring them to any get together. She loved to crochet, needlepoint and quilt. She made many beautiful afghans, doilies, pictures which she shared with family and friends.

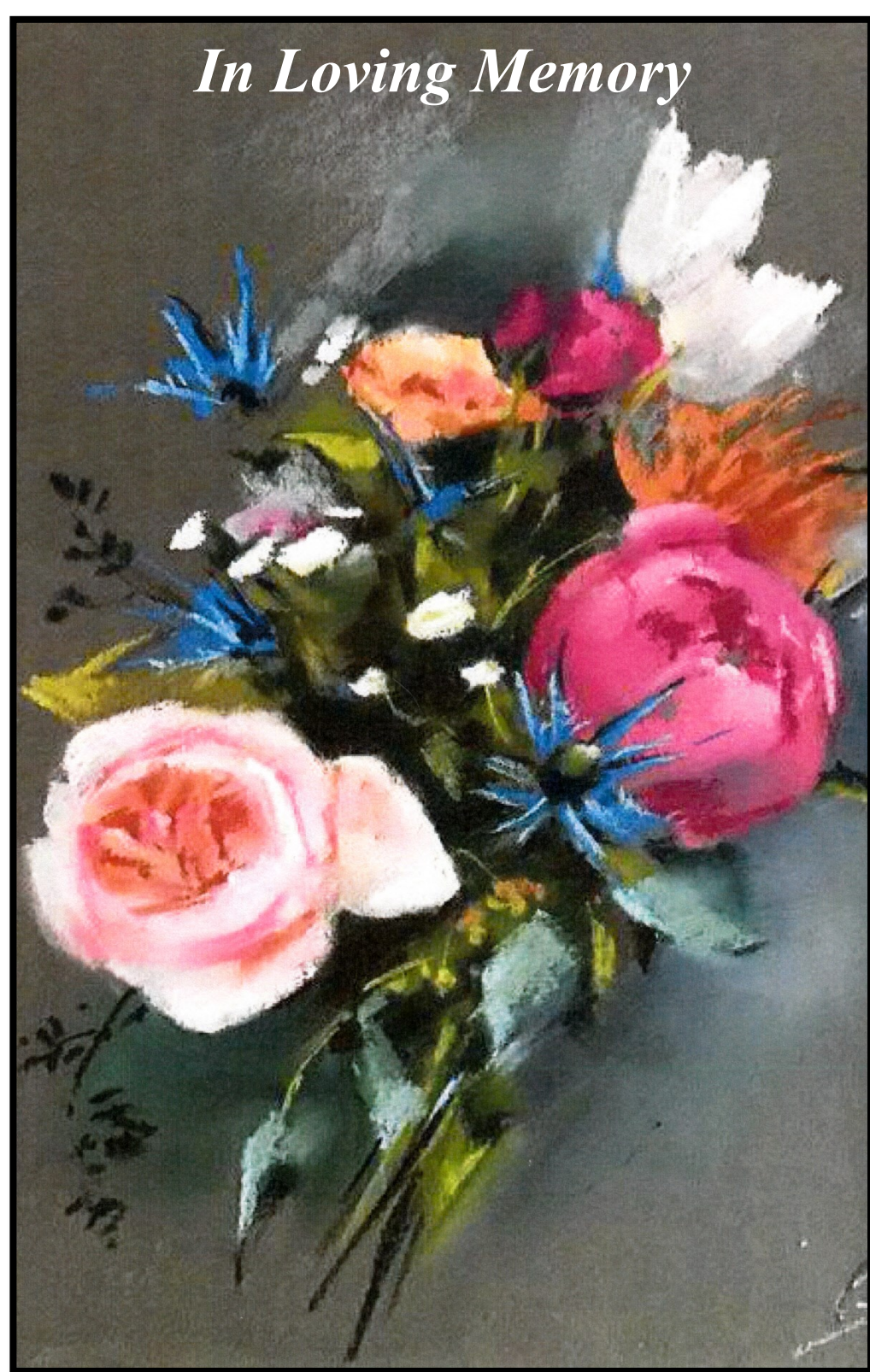
