Animals are screened every three months, in line with veterinary recommendations. Animals testing positive for zoonitic diseases are not to be used for handling until further testing clears them. The biosecurity protocol prevents the transmittion of diseases between enclosures and individuals with the same enclosure are screened as a group.
