Prelude *Entrance Rite (with the reading of Romans 6:3-5, NKJV)

P: Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the source of all mercy and the God of all consolation. He comforts us in all our sorrows so that we can comfort others in their sorrows with the consolation we ourselves have received from God.

C: Thanks be to God.

P: In Holy Baptism Janet was clothed with the robe of Christ's righteousness that covered all her sin. St. Paul writes: "Or do you not know that as many of us as were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death? For if we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so God will bring with Him those who sleep in Jesus. For this we say to you by the word of the Lord, that we who are alive and remain until the coming of the Lord will by no means precede those who are asleep. For the Lord Himself will descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of an archangel, and with the trumpet of God. And the dead in Christ will rise first.
