




Principal's Message:

This morning I read the chapter in the Desire of Ages called, The Divine Shepherd. I thought I would share some highlights with you. The author, Ellen White, mentions that sheep are tuned in to their shepherd's voice. She describes the practice of the shepherds of that time. They would walk ahead of their flock of sheep, preparing the way for them...cutting away poisonous plants, checking for predators, etc. When things were safe, the shepherd called and the sheep would respond. The shepherd did not come behind them with prodding or pushing. As I compare the sheep with myself and the shepherd with God, I see why Jesus used this familiar sight with the people of that day. He wanted them to see what God was really like. Once their misperceptions about His character were understood, their eyes could be opened. I like this image of God! As we learn more about who He is and learn to trust Him, we see that he is trustworthy. He meticulously works on our behalf... meeting our needs, providing comfort, giving us His peace in tumultuous times, etc. The shepherd, Jesus, has gone before. He paved the way so that I can receive salvation. His perfect life was offered as a sacrifice so that I can have eternal life. When I look at the matchless love of Christ, I can't help but learn to trust Him. It is my job to trust, listen and respond to the shepherd. In order for this to happen I have to know His voice. Like the shepherds of old, God does not force his ways on me. He gives me the freedom to choose. Do I listen to the shepherd or not? This choice is up to me. If I have taken the time to see the shepherd for who He is, I can't help but learn to trust Him. The sheep that know the shepherd's voice do not worry or fret. Instead they trust the divine shepherd. They know that he has their back! This trust leads to surrender, which in turn leads to a life of peace.
