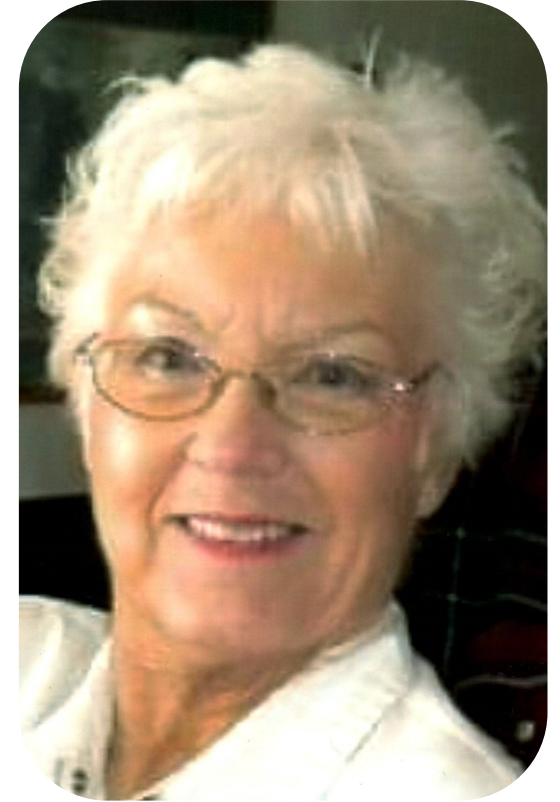

Beatrice Y. “Bea” Sleeth, 83, died peacefully in her sleep March 6, 2024. Bea was born August 31, 1940, in Townsend, Montana, the first of six children of Wayne and Hazel Strehlow. Her family lived in Bainbridge Island, Washington during WWII, she had many fond memories from her time there. Her younger years were spent relocating from one small town to another small town in Montana and North Dakota, following her father’s employment in the oil field industry. She moved from place to place until she found the right place, Baker, Montana, where she met and married her high school sweetheart, George R. Sleeth. They had been married for 65 years. When they were first married, they lived in Southern California at the Naval Base. After George was honorably discharged from the US Navy they returned to Montana.
