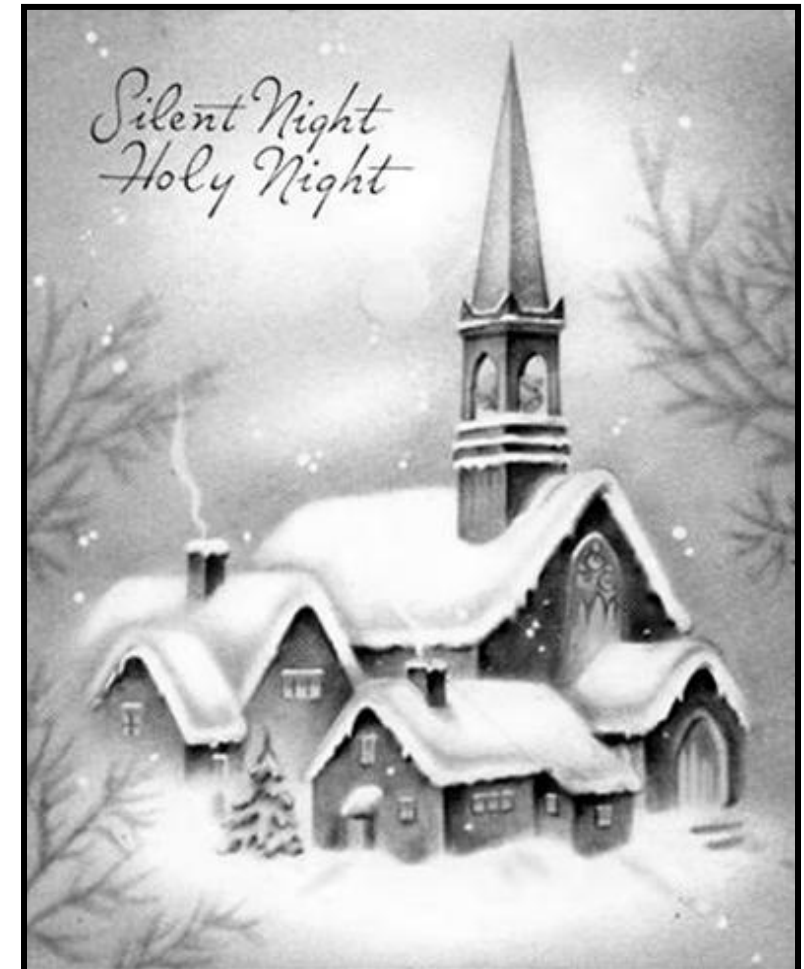

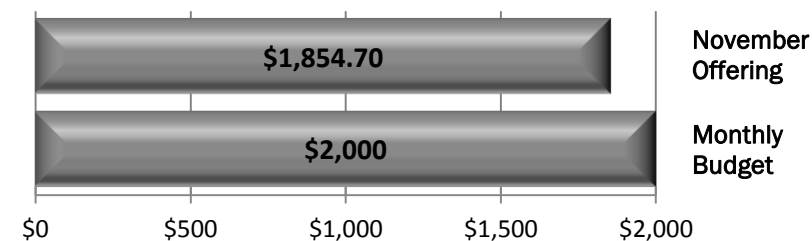
Announcements

Special Gems on Jesus’ First Advent

“...in Heaven’s council the hour for the Coming of Christ had been determined. When the great clock of time pointed to that hour, Jesus was born in Bethlehem. ‘When the fullness of the time was come, God sent forth His Son.’ [Gal. 4:4]... Outside of the Jewish nation...
