

Lynn Allen Bohn

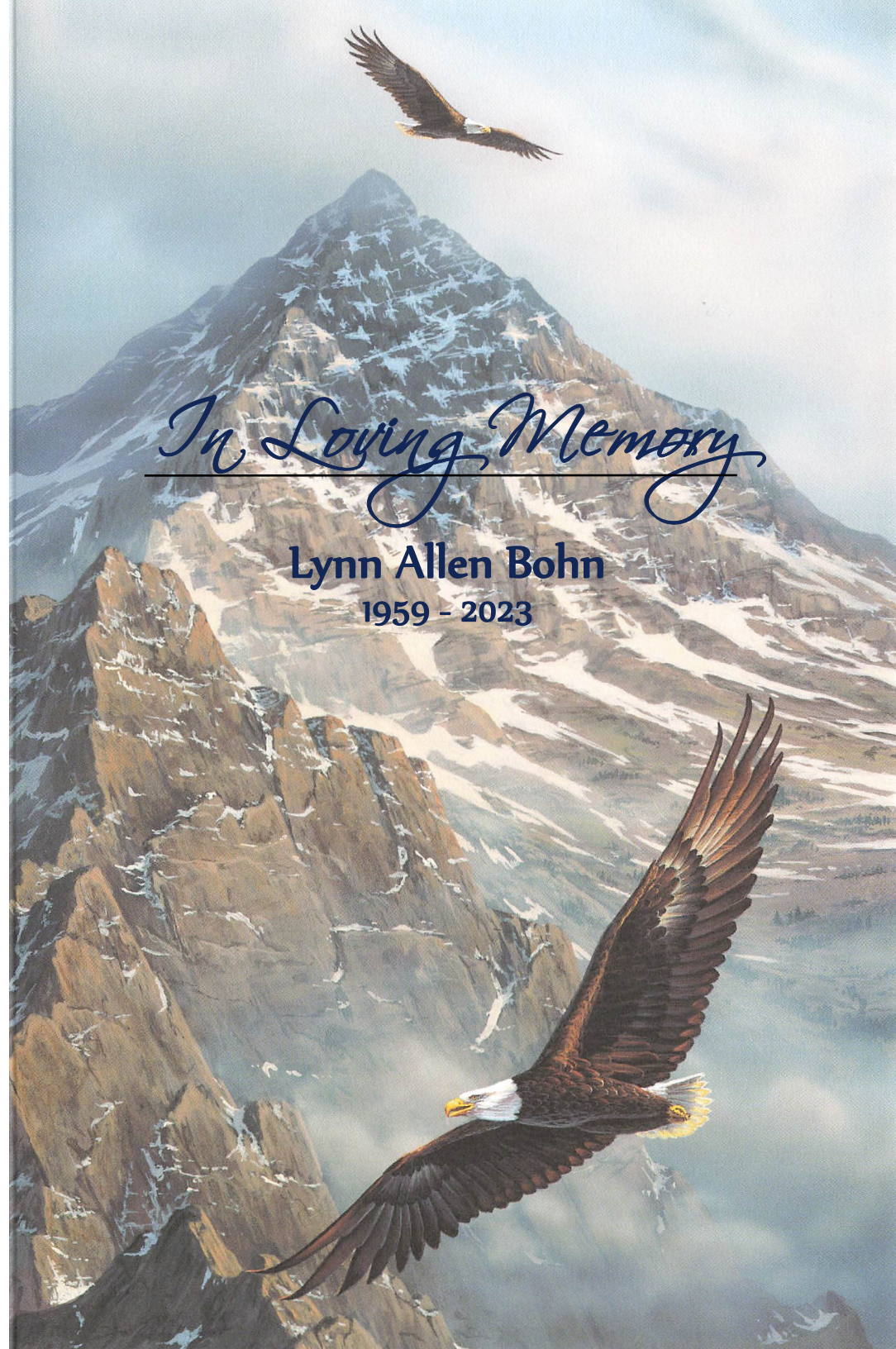

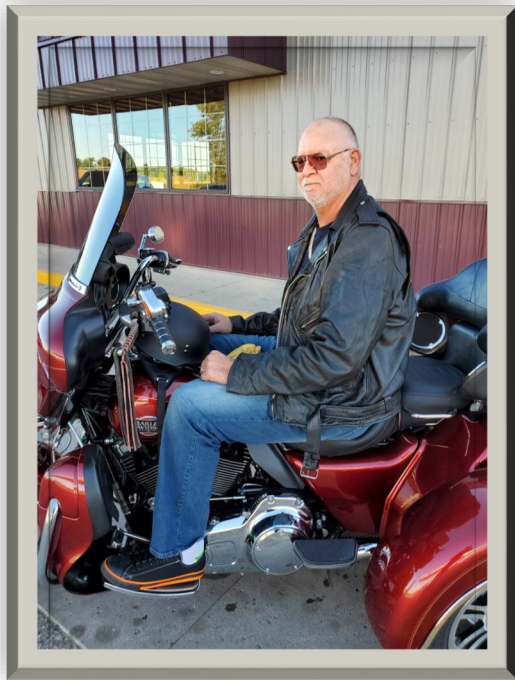
He was preceded in death by his father Harold.
