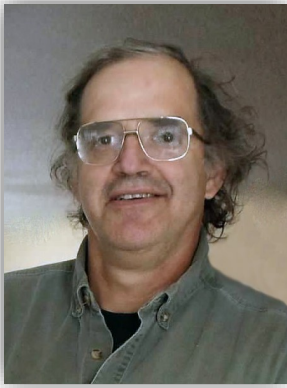


In Loving Memory
