Alfred Gabriel Gunderson was born on February 23, 1931, in Willmar, Minnesota, the son of Alfred and Esther (Forcier) Gunderson. He grew up in Willmar, was raised in the Catholic faith, received his education in the Willmar schools and returned to work on the family farm. He enlisted in the U.S. Army and served in the Korean War with the 587th Combat Engineer Battalion from 1951 to 1952. On April 10, 1954, Alfred was married to Mavis Evelyn Knutson and they made their home in Willmar. He was employed by the Great Northern & Burlington Northern Railroad for over 45 years as a brakeman and conductor. He was a member of the Burlington Northern Veteran's Association and National Association of Retired Veteran Railroad Employees. He served as Local Chairman for the Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen for 10 years and as Assistant Local Chairman for Conductors for 6 years. Alfred enjoyed fishing, deer hunting and sports. He was an avid fan of the MN Twins and MN Vikings.

He is survived by his loving wife, Mavis; four children, Rebecca (and Richard) Bergeson of Montevideo, Pauline Ledeboer of Willmar, Timothy (and Dawn) Gunderson of Blaine and Paul Gunderson of Willmar; nine grandchildren and nine great grandchildren.
