She attended school in Garretson, De Smet, South Dakota and Dell Rapids, South Dakota. On November 12, 1941 Marcella was united in marriage to Earl Brown in Garretson. The couple then moved to Sioux Falls in 1943 where Marcella did child daycare for years. They then moved to Sioux City, Iowa in 1966 where Earl worked for the railroad while Marcella stayed home raising their growing family. After Earl's retirement from the railroad company, the couple moved to Hatton, North Dakota. The couple remained living there until 1989, when they moved to Jasper, Minnesota to be closer to family. After the sudden and tragic loss her husband in 2002, Marcella remained at home until moving into the Good Samaritan Communities of Pipestone. Early in the morning of April 15, 2023, Marcella peacefully passed from this life and joined her husband, Earl in the arms of her Lord and Savior at the age of 101 years, 5 months, and 19 days.
