

Surrounded by his loving family, Terry David Schmidt, 58, passed away peacefully at Hutchinson Regional Medical Center on June, 28, 2024. Terry was born August 13, 1965, at McPherson Memorial Hospital in McPherson, Kansas to Beauferd and DeAnn (Williams) Schmidt.

Terry grew up on a farm South of Canton, Kansas and attended McPherson High School and graduated in 1983. Terry was the middle of three children and enjoyed being ornery with his older brother Tony and younger brother Heath.
