William "Al" Cohen entered eternal rest on March 24, 2021. Al was born on April 17, 1931, the eldest of seven children born to the union of the late Hammond and Viola Cohen.

Al was educated in the New York public schools. After high school, he enlisted in the United States Army and served during the Korean War. After a short military career, Al was honorably discharged and returned to New York City where he held various positions until finding his niche in the United States Postal Service. After relocating to South Carolina, he initially held a position at Low County General Hospital and later became a serial entrepreneur running several businesses.

As a child, Al fellowshipped at Saint Andrews Episcopal Church in New York City, after relocating to Pineland, SC, he attended Gillison Branch Baptist Church. Upon moving to Savannah, Georgia, he attended the First Pilgrim Missionary Baptist Church where he was ordained a Deacon in 2002. I am the gentle autumn rain.


When you wake in the morning hush,








































