Alfred L. Brown (Pee wee) was born January 11, 1960 in Las Vegas, Nevada to Rossie and Louis D Brown. He was the eighth of his parents ten children.

He went to Highland Elementary School. He was the 4th grade Ice skating champion, of all the 4th graders, he won a football championship, in 5th grade, was captain of the patrol guards in 6th grade. He danced & played the congos for the band of Gypsies, a family group. He was fired from the group which put a fire in him to learn the Lead guitar. His brother Henry ask if he wanted a guitar. His mom bought it and the rest is history.

Alfred was an excellent self taught Lead Guitarist...and I mean excellent! He impressed music teachers, friends, and family with his musical skills at a very young age.

He played with Pure Hell Band at age 15. When he went for the audition they look at him and said what this kid know about a guitar. He hooked up and did what he knew best and made that baby sing. Needless to say he wow'd them as he always did. He went on tour with these brothers that would later become a great influence in his spiritual walk. God building relationships.

Later on he would rejoin his family group The Band of The Gypsies. As the band would practice they would at times stop practice and say to him where did you learn to play like that. They would play at many events across the valley even out of state. Every-body knew & loved the Gypsies.

In 1976 Alfred would meet his high school sweetheart, Barbara Woods. The two were inseparable, and they shared their lives together for 46 and a half years. Pee wee & Barbara would eventually welcome their twin daughters, LaShunda & TaShunda. 3 years later on April 26, 1979 they were married to forever seal the deal on their love for each other.

They would join the Seventh Day Adventist Church and were baptized together January 1, 2000. He became an Elder for Present Truth Seventh Day Adventist Church & Later For Three Angels Seventh Day Adventist Church. Preaching & teaching the word

Specializing in the music, the Special Resurrection, the State of the Dead, The Sabbath & the Judgment.

He was employed at K-Mart, Pep Boys, Nellis AFB, Fox Rent a Car. An excellent & honest mechanic. Customers would wait in line to have Al work on their car. People across the valley and out of state knew him as an excellent mechanic and friend.

Many of his co-workers were lead to the Lord by working with Al as he was always open to share his faith with whomever would listen. Quick to do Bible studies, give out literature...and open the Word and teach yet humble & caring.

He was a great story teller. Everyone loved to hear him tell of events that happened in the bible or in the family. Alfred had a way to captivate your attention.

He loved family and believed in family. Whenever someone needed him he was there. He gave some great advice, and he always kept it real. At times he may not have said what you wanted to hear, but in the end, he said the things that you truly needed to hear. His sense of humor was unmatched in many ways. He was always a straight shooter.
