And saw your tired face.


He put His arms around you And lifted you to rest. God's garden must be beautiful, He always takes the best.

While growing up in the Tracy and Balaton area, Julie enjoyed singing with the Junior Choir, and was active with the Garvin High Fliers 4-H Club for over 10 years where she showed cattle, gardening, canning, and won the titles: "Little Miss Homemaker" and "Dairy Princess" of Lyon County (1974). Julie graduated from Balaton High School in 1974. She then attended Willmar Community College and earned her certificate, before working at the Balaton Nursing Home as a dietary aide and Certified Nursing Assistant.
