

> To enter into pleasures Of the beauty I have seen Since I was given entrance To a place upon the green





Mr. Jessie Michael "Mike" Baston, age 73, entered into rest on Sunday, August 20, 2023, at his residence on River Road in the Fortsonia Community of Elberton. Mike courageously fought cancer for four years, and his last days were spent surrounded by family and friends that he loved so dearly.

Affectionately known as "Big Mike", he was born in Augusta on July 27, 1950, to Claude O'Neal Baston and Verna Grace "Bunny" Jennings Baston. The Bastons moved to Elberton when Mike was 6 and his dad accepted employment with McLanahan Crushed Stone. He began working in the granite industry and did so for the remainder of his career, his last place of employment being along side his son at Baston Monuments, Inc. This afforded him the opportunity to share his love of the sport, as well as the love of Jesus, with many young folks.

As long as his health permitted, Mike was an active member of Fortsonia Baptist Church. He was a member of the church choir and often sang solos, was the teacher of the Mike Baston Adult II Sunday school class, and previously served as a deacon.

Mike loved working and his sons and grandchildren brought him immense joy. He relished the many friends he made throughout the years, and made it a point to stay in contact with them - even those across the world, literally. Mike taught us all how to love life and live it to the fullest because he certainly did.
