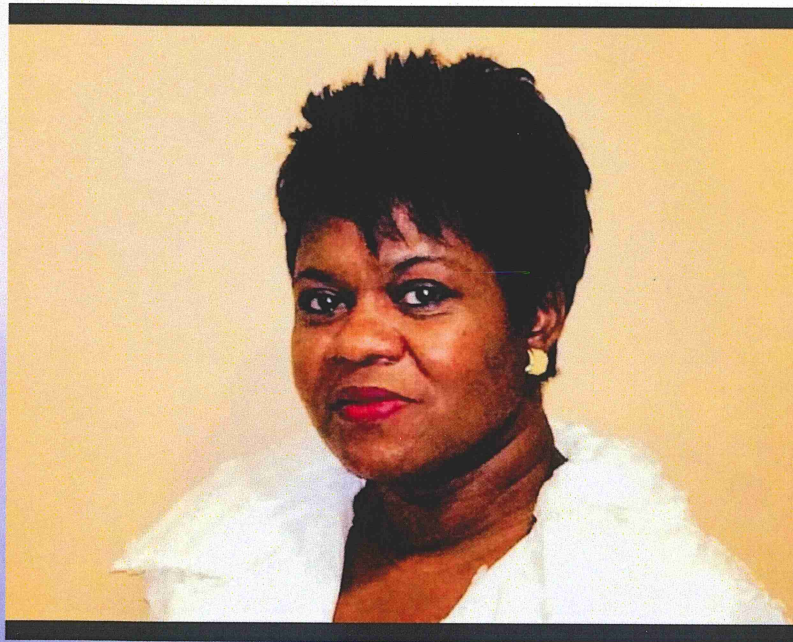

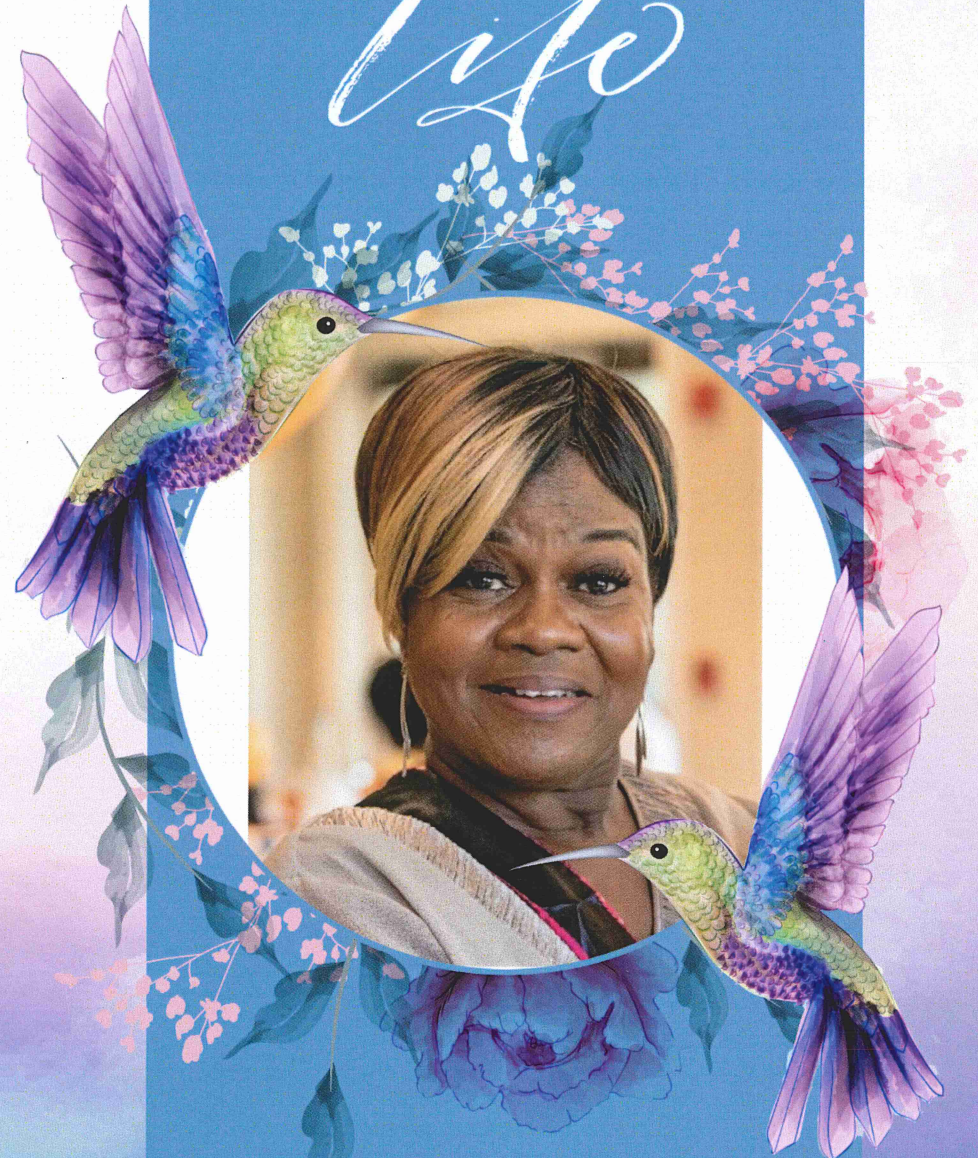

# OBITUARY

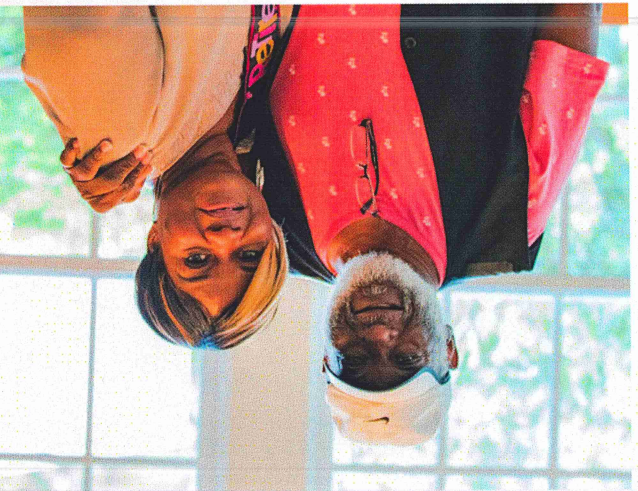
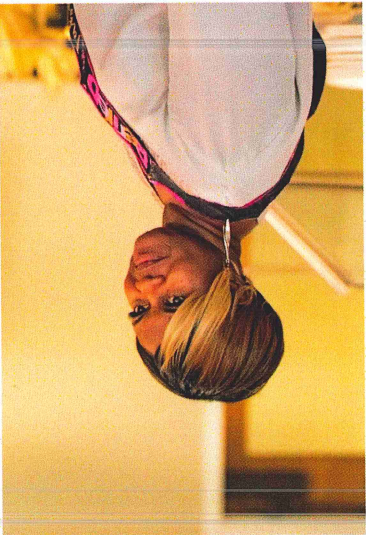
