



Tales Toolkit Project Action Plan (13th September 2022):

- Invite staff & Initial meeting – July 2022
- Meetings: Meetings to be monthly on the 1st Tuesday of each month in term time at 3.30pm at Eastcroft Park Primary school.
- **Timeline** – 1st part of funding secured July 2022, details to be completed by CY September 2022 to secure payment to be made to school account.
 - Order of materials to be made as soon as payment received.
 - 1st meeting in new term 13th September 2022.
 - New staff to be added to group September 2022 (AM/RB/CVAG) taking number of members to 11.
 - Online training to begin mid September 2022 as self-initiated CPD by staff
 - Start sessions using the resources by 14th October 2022 (provided Tales Toolkit resources have been received)
 - Initial impact study to be completed mid November 2022 provided other timescales met.
 - Potential roll-out to nursery & parents from January 2023.
- **Budget** - initially funding amounts of £560 with top up funding of £240 once impact study completed. Additional resourcing costs (other than costs of resources/training) to be funded by Eastcroft Park primary school. Cost of roll-out to nursery and parents to be met initially by Eastcroft Park but we will look into fundraising in January 2023 depending on costs.
 - Initial cost of the training & resources is £800
- **COVID 19 plan:**

Meetings intended to be in-person but to be guided by school's COVID 19 risk assessment. As an alternative I will set up Zoom meetings if deemed unsafe/inappropriate to meet in person.

- **Expected Impact:**

As we have seen the resources used in other local primary schools and be really effective, we are hoping that the project will have a similar impact. Our environment is a very economically disadvantaged area with very high numbers of free school meals children (As much as 80% in some cohorts). On entry children have very low levels of oracy and we have witnessed huge numbers of communication & language difficulties post-COVID. We are hopeful that these resources and training will encourage speech and have a positive impact on the standards of oracy and then literacy over time. If the project does have a positive impact then we are looking to extend it to our nursery cohort and also to run parents sessions to encourage use at home.
