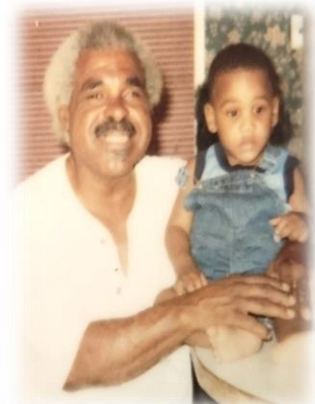

Lanzell Walker, Jr. departed this earthly life at age 76 on Wednesday, October 5, 2022. He was born October 31, 1945, in DeKalb, Mississippi, he was the youngest of three children between Lanzell Walker, Sr. and Geraldine Walker.

Lanzell attended West Livingston High School in Denham Springs, Louisiana, where he excelled in athletics and math. Baptized at an early age as a member of Roberts United Methodist Church in Denham Springs, Louisiana.

Lanzell was the brightest of a thousand points of light. In victory, he taught us never to be defined by failure. He showed us how setbacks can strengthen, he taught us what it means to be a wonderful father, grandfather, and great grandfather. He was firm in his principles and supportive as we began to seek our own ways. He encouraged and comforted, but never steered. He was the great example of unconditional love.

Lanzell was always busy, a man in constant motion; but never too busy to share his love of life with those around him. He taught us to love the outdoors. Dad was a history buff and could answer any questions about history; watching the

history channels was his favorite past time. Genuinely an optimistic man, he guided his children to believe anything is possible.

Our father had many talents:

- Extraordinary cook
- Very good athlete, especially in basketball and baseball
- Excellent mechanic -- built a car motor from pieces, put them all together, then took the motor apart to only put it back together again.
- Accomplished heating and air (HVAC) and appliance technician -- he trained himself and taught others on many levels. He had an uncanny ability to take a non-working washer or dyer apart and repair it. With a quick glance, he knew the problem and fixed it.
- Teacher – In his 40s, he excelled quickly as the lead printer for Jimmy Swagger’s Church and went on to teach others.
- Great judge of character and a straightforward man who demanded little from those around him yet expected only the best for his three children.
- Very intelligent man -- he taught us math at a level beyond the school teacher, and we were able to achieve the same answer in a different way.

Lanzell loved his family, and taught us how to grow old with dignity, humor, and kindness. When the Lord finally called, he showed us how to meet Him with courage and with joy in the promise of what lies ahead.

We’re going to miss you. Your decency, sincerity, and kind soul will stay with us forever. So, through our tears, let us see the blessings of knowing and loving you – a great and noble man, and the best father a son or daughter could have.
