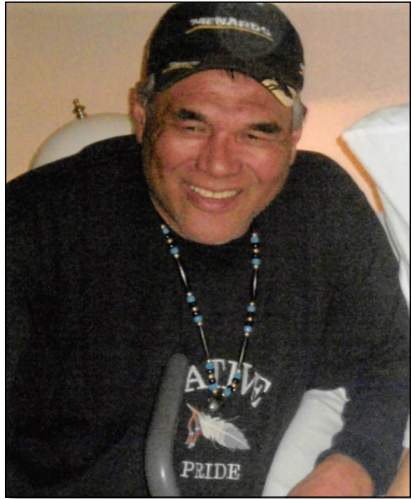


*Philip E. Warren, 56, Mahanomen, MN died Friday, April 20, 2018

He is preceded in death by his father Edward Warren and one grandson: Devin Thompson.

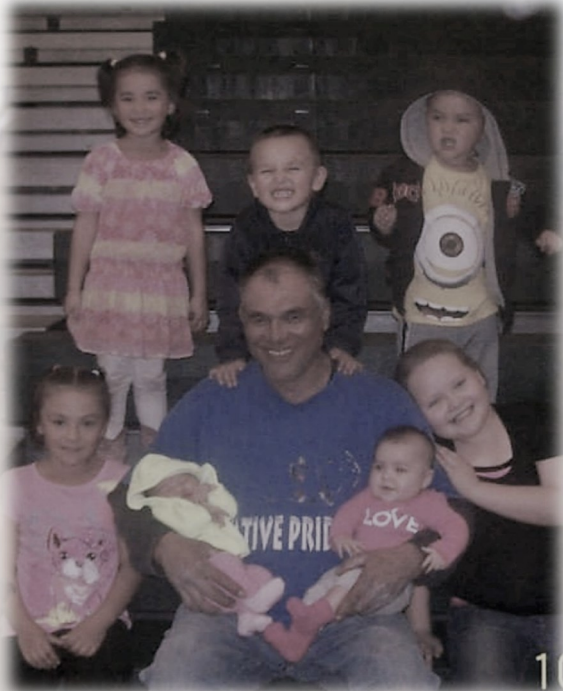




WHEN I'M GONE
