

Minor in Landscape Architecture, 15 Units

The Minor in Landscape Architecture introduces foundational aspects in the practice and scholarship of the built environment. The discipline of landscape architecture thrives in diversity, embracing the nuances and complexities of physical, biological, and climatological systems.

This minor exposes students to a range of design scales from the urban environment to the garden scale, with a focus on public space, infrastructure, new and old media. Courses introduce how the design of landscape affects the social, cultural, and ecological dimensions of the world. History and theory compliment science and the arts to equip students with the tools, knowledge, and innovative skills to enrich any major.

Notes

For architecture majors, 12 units must be in the Minor only and cannot be double-counted toward another major or minor.

Elective options may vary each semester and each year. The Minor Advisor can help determine courses that best meet a student's interest areas.

In the event a required course is not offered in a given semester, or if a student has irreconcilable scheduling conflicts with their required Major or Minor courses, appropriate alternate courses may be substituted after discussion and approval from the Minor Advisor.
