A sustained investigation of color. Course deepens students' understanding of color's complexity and pervasiveness, and develops technical and conceptual skills to aid in its visual translation. Emphasis on color and culture. Projects are open to multi-dimensional solutions in various media.

Methods and Contexts I and Methods and Contexts II: 2013, 2016/17, 2018/19, 2019/20 A team-taught course which integrates and synthesizes upper-level Art Practice courses and other studio courses. Supported by lectures, class discussions, and critiques, this course fosters creative methodologies and critical discourse surrounding various artistic practices.

Painting Area Spring 2004, 2012 - 2014

EcoArt 2011, 2020

Eco-art explores the intersection of art, ecology and ethics. This studio-based course explores various artistic practices and working methodologies related to environmental art.
