


Our Mother

Celebrating the life of our dear Florence Bullinger

August 29, 1927-November 7, 2024

Florence "Flo" Bullinger, 97, of Mandan, passed away peacefully on November 7, 2024, surrounded by her loving family at Good Samaritan Society on Sunset in Mandan.

Florence, born August 29, 1927, to Art and Rosalie (Kruckenberg) Birkholz in Krem, North Dakota, was the oldest of 12, four girls and eight boys.
