

On the evening of June 27, 2019 Archie Aschnewitz answered the call of the Lord to join him in heaven.

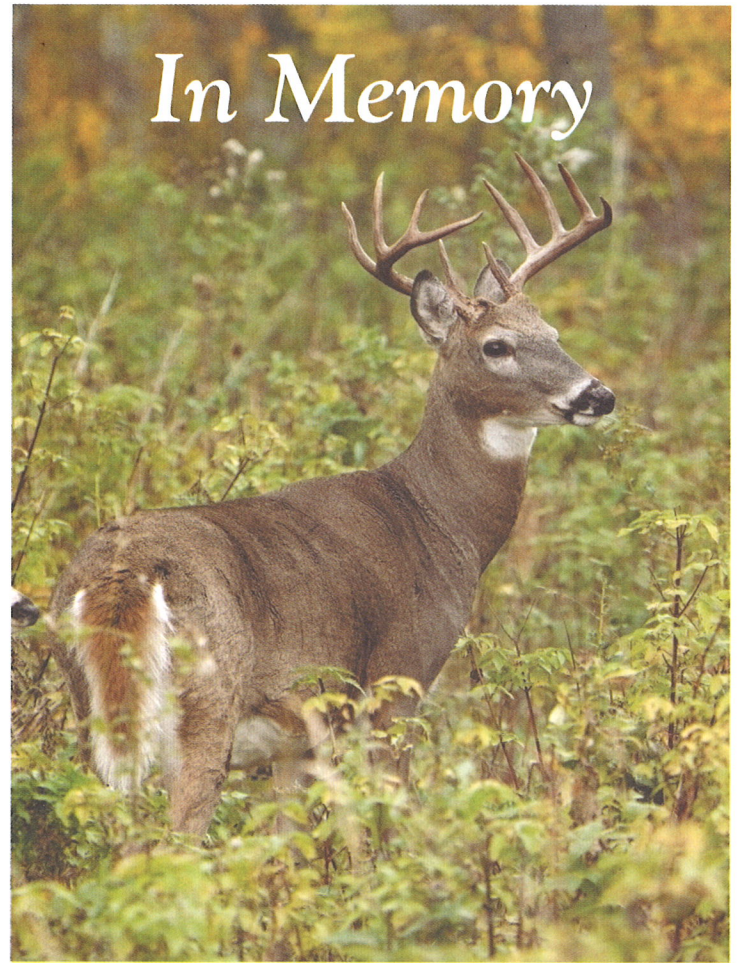
