Jacquelyn Sue Heesch was born on May 23, 1958 to Eldon and Marjorie (Rasmusen) Schmidt in Tyler, Minnesota and grew up on the family farm near Lake Benton, Minnesota. Following her education, Jackie had various sewing jobs, working for a number of years in upholstery at Bayliner Marine in Pipestone, Minnesota. In 1993, Jackie began working in healthcare and enrolled in school Southwestern Technical College for administration and accounting, graduating in June 1994.
