Rev Alan writes...

My Church Commitment - To Give











Last week I gave details of our Parish Vision to grow in commitment to church: "Jesus' Family on Jesus' Mission". Over the coming weeks in our morning services, we are learning more about what this means in our five areas of commitment to *Give, Meet, Serve, Baptise and Pray*. This week I am writing about our commitment to *Give*.

We read in Acts 4:32-37 the account of how members of the early church shared all their possessions and money, nobody went without, and everyone was committed to giving. The bible teaches us that all things come from God. So, in a sense what we may regard as ours is really what God has entrusted to us as stewards in the first place. This understanding helps loosen the grip that money can have on us and encourages a spirit of generosity to bless others with God's gifts.

A commitment to **Give** to the mission of the church is a keyway to show your commitment. You can give weekly on the offering plate, or by using the card tap machines, or make a regular commitment and set up a standing order to give through your bank account. Details are available at all our services, or Parish Office, or website: https://stpetersparish.info/giving/ and if you pay tax your giving can be Gift Aided which increases the amount you give by 25% at no extra cost to you! We also have details on ways you can leave a legacy to church.

All money given to church is used for mission and ministry. It means we can reach out and help people in our community – things like activities for children and youth, regular groups, supporting those who are sick or needy, giving to mission causes in the poorest areas of the world, operating and maintaining our buildings, employing our staff team, and playing our part in contributing to the costs of providing clergy and the Diocese, which means that churches continue in all areas across the Greater Manchester.
