
NO SCHOOL On President's Day, Monday, February 17th. Hope you enjoy some family time!


Attention Cast & Crew: PRODUCTION WEEK is Here! Mary Poppins opening night is 8 days away.

This Week's Elementary Academic Highlight: Mrs. Fralick, our 7th & 8th grade teacher, invited her students to expound upon John 15:4-5 by writing a devotional thought that would explain it's meaning. Giovanna Burgos, an 8th grader, wrote the following:

God knows we're not perfect like we were meant to be. He knows how we're sinful and make mistakes, but he gives us the freedom of choice; good, or evil. It's like everyone in the world has a puzzle piece that represents their whole life. It belongs in a huge masterpiece created by God. But he lets you choose whether you put your piece down to be a part of his masterpiece, or choose to keep your life for yourself.

In John 15:4-5 it says that apart from God, we can do nothing. Being apart from God is like not choosing to put down your puzzle piece and doing what *you* want with your life. God wants you to choose to be a part of his puzzle and give *him* your life. He wants to help you understand his laws and his love for you, and he wants you to grow in your own unique bond with him. He wants you to have a wonderful life, but more importantly, he wants to be a part of your daily life--your triumphs and your sorrows, your weaknesses and your strengths--he wants to be there with you. God doesn't want to have any missing puzzle pieces.
