

Beloved husband, father, grandfather, brother and friend, James (Jim) DeWayne Nelson, formerly of Spicer, age 80, passed away unexpectedly on April 8, in Fort Myers, FL. Jim is also survived by his siblings: Alma Holcomb, Doris Boie, Roger (Joyce) Nelson, Jeanne Jorgenson, Larry (Mary) Nelson, Dianne (Larry) Henjum and Nancy (Ron) Nelson.

He wintered down in southern Texas for several years where he made lifelong friendships. The past few winters were spent in Fort Myers, FL where he enjoyed the weather.
