Why Worry?

For this month's issue, I intended to write about our progress in fundraising for Highland Restore (after all, we still have a considerable amount of money to raise to pay for our church renovations). I also wanted to make another appeal to all our church members to bring a special "Thank Offering" to our Thanksgiving Feast on November 11. As I began to organize my thoughts, however, I found myself going in another direction. You see, I realized that I was being motivated by something that was not of God—worry. Worry that I have not communicated our need clearly enough. Worry that we would not get good participation. Worry that we would fall behind financially. Worry, worry, worry.

I had to stop and admit that I was not following a Biblical principle that I know to be true. The principle is one that Jesus Himself taught, "Do not worry about tomorrow; for tomorrow will care for itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own (Mt. 6:25-33)." So, I decided to spend a few minutes on this instead.

As Jesus presented this reassuring principle, He acknowledged that we have needs. He said in verse 32, "Your Father knows you have need of all these things [food, clothing, shelter, etc.]" But He then goes on to say that we need not worry about these things.

Three Reasons Christians Need Not Worry:

- 1. Worry is useless: "Who of you by being worried can add a single hour to his life? (v. 27)."
- 2. **Life is a gift:** "Do not be worried about your life...Look at the birds of the air...your heavenly Father feeds them...Are you not worth much more than they (vv. 25,26,30)?"
- 3. **Worry is pagan (sin):** "Do not worry...For the Gentiles eagerly seek all these things; for your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things (vv. 31,32)."

Worry comes from a fundamental mistrust of God, the Creator and Sustainer. It comes from a misunderstanding of (or forgetting about) His love.

The Antidote to Worry:

1. **Live today:** "Do not worry about tomorrow; for tomorrow will care for itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own (v. 34)."

Let's remember that life is a gift. Let's not waste today being worried about tomorrow. When you start to feel worries creeping up on you, start praising God for today's blessings. We have so much to be thankful for. Praise God for His promises of abundance. It's impossible to praise and worry at the same time.

2. **Live in God's economy** "But seek first His kingdom and His righteousness, and all these things will be added to you (v. 33)."

Jesus teaches that, because of redemption, we live in a new economy of abundance. We have been adopted by a generous Father, "Who did not [even] spare His own Son, but delivered Him over for us all, how will He not also with Him freely give us all things? (Rom. 8:32)." Jesus does not want His followers to be burdened with worry. He wants us to be secure in our heavenly relationship—sons and daughters of the King.

With this renewed in my mind, I ask myself, I ask you, "Why worry?"


Everyone's Favorite: Lunch Time!
