Nana taught me

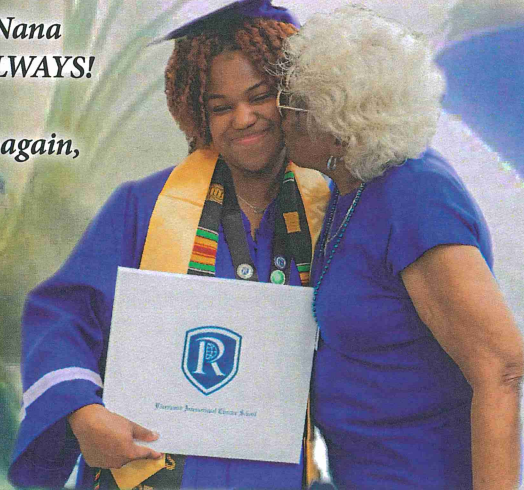
how to be the best me

All those I dearly love.

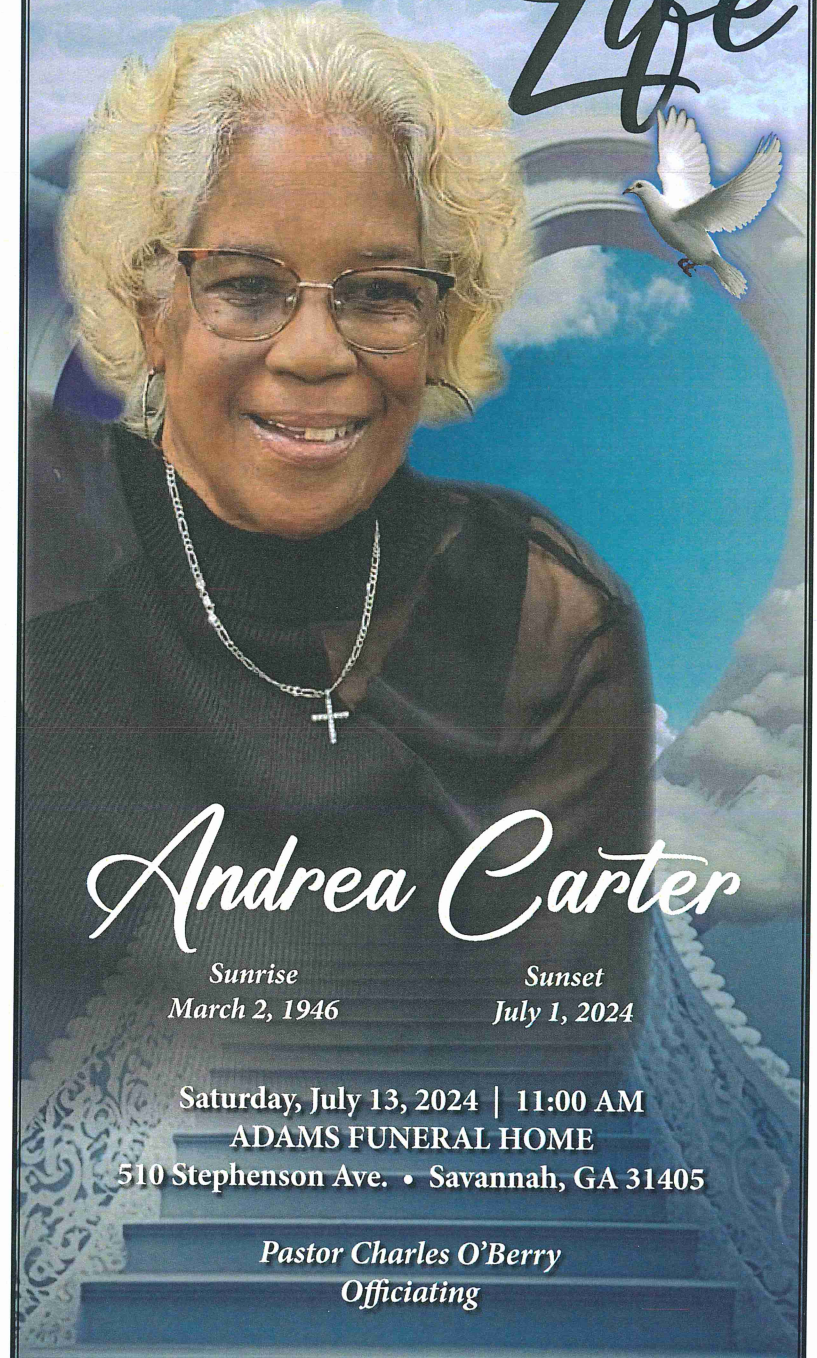

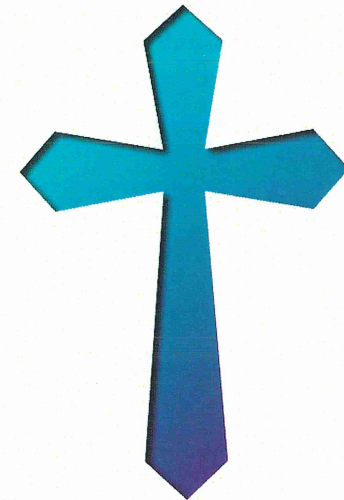
