
# Miss Me, But let Me Go

oger was the son of Henry & Dorothy (Paszek) Henning. He grew up on the family farm. In the days of CB radios, his handle was the "Artful Dodger", a play on the novel, Oliver Twist by Charles Dickens.

After he graduated from Webster High School in 1975, he worked for John Deere until he attended SDSU where he graduated as a Mechanical Engineer. He was employed by General Dynamics in California and later relocated to North Platte, Nebraska where he continued his career with Gerald Gentleman Station, the state's largest electricity generating plant.
