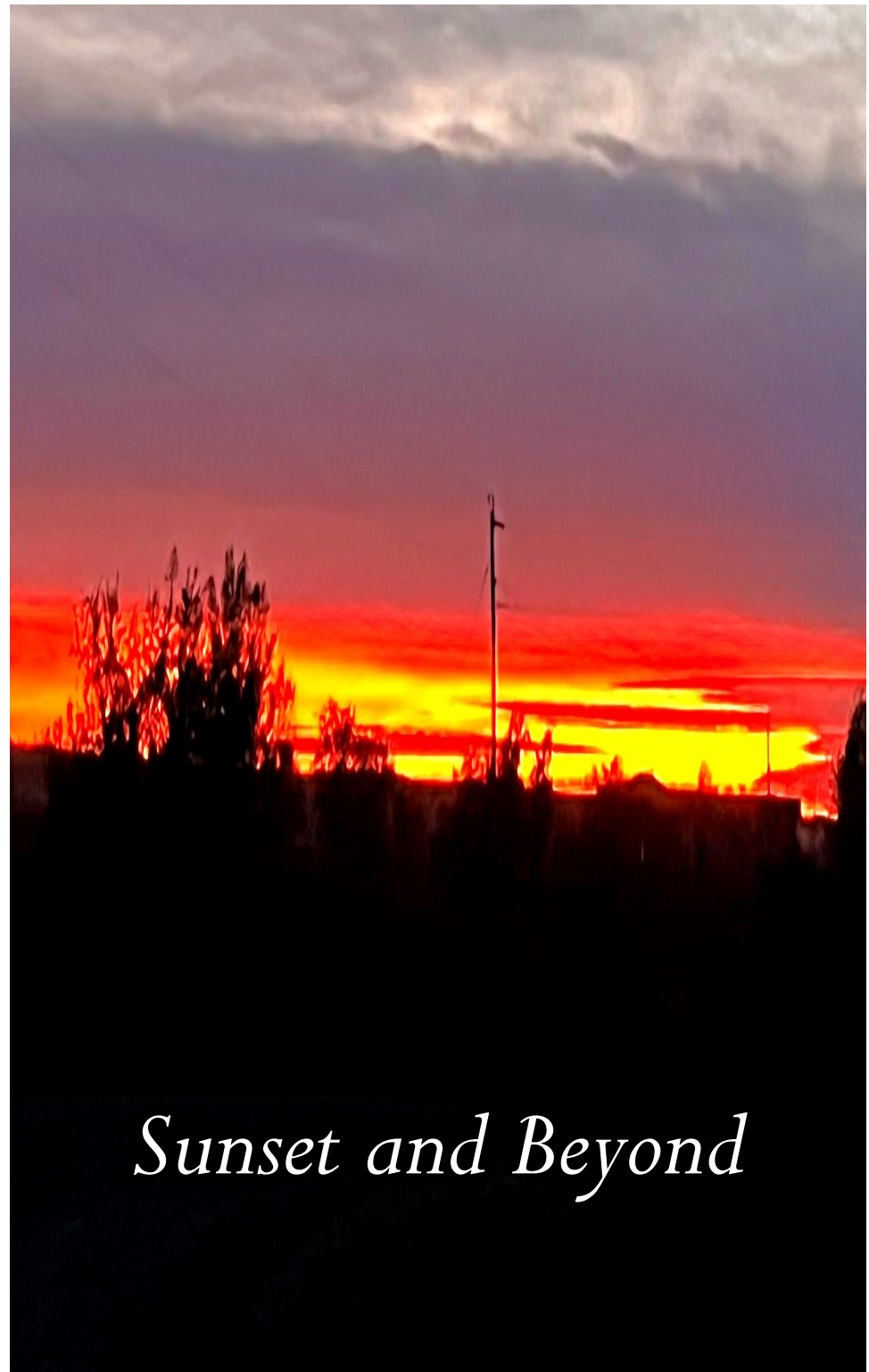
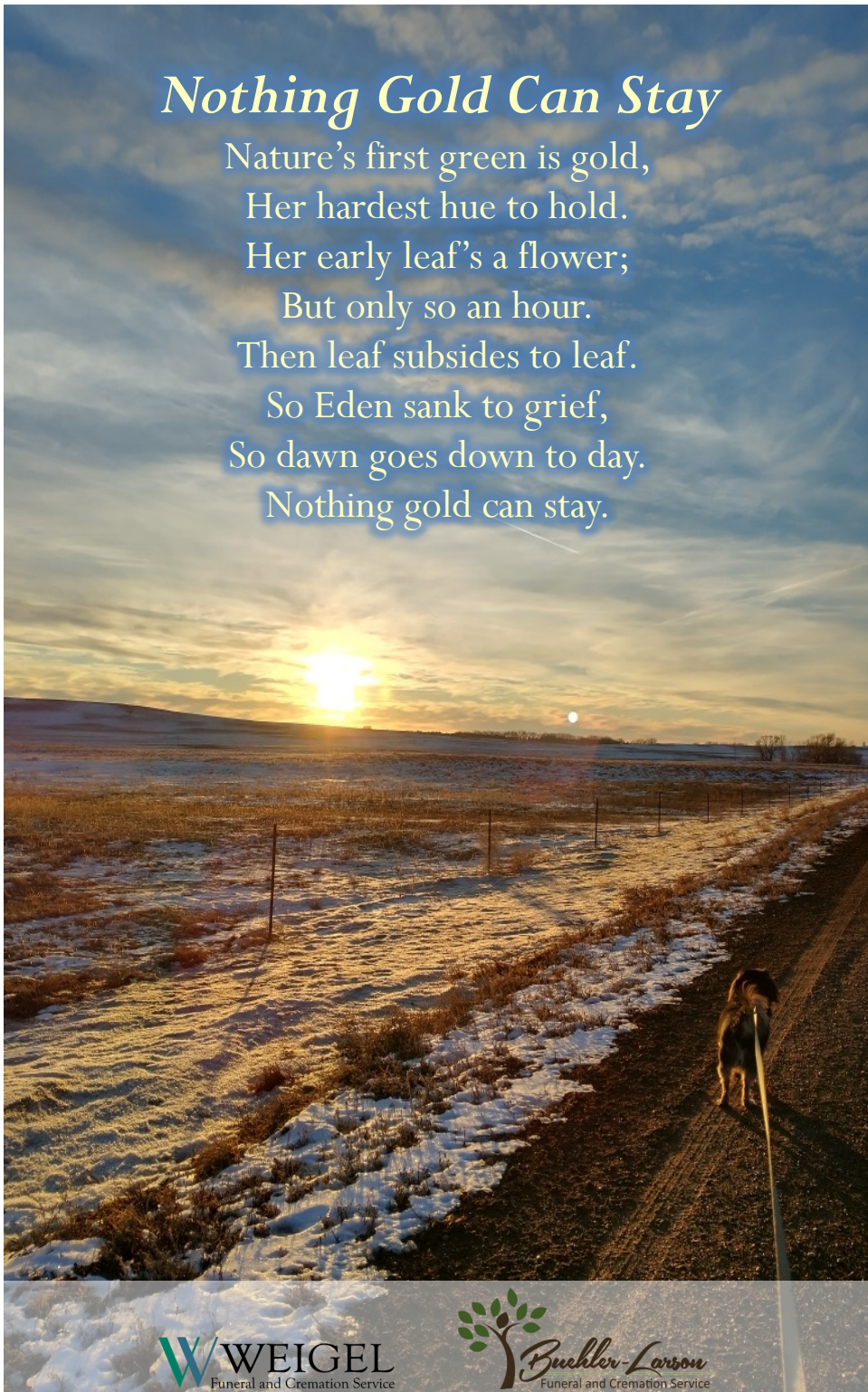


Nothing Gold Can Stay
